MUST NOT ENCROACH

ALASKA ROADS NOT TO BE AN
INCH LESS THAN SIXTY
FEET WIDE

SO SAYS THE LAW

AND ROAD COMMISSIONERS IS-
SUE AN ULTIMATUM TO
THAT EFFECT

SKAGWAY, July 21.—The following circular has been issued by the board of road commissioners and all road construction will be governed accordingly:

Under authority contained in the law providing for the Board of Road commissioners for Alaska act approved January 27, 1905, the width of all roads and trails located, constructed and maintained by the board of road commissioners of Alaska is fixed at sixty feet, thirty feet on each side of the center line of such road or trail, except in special cases where a less width may be declared.

No encroachment will be permitted upon this strip, unless authority has been previously obtained from the road commission.

Maps of routes located and constructed will be prepared and issued as soon after completion as possible.
