WHEREAS, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Juneau, Alaska,

has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Olof Wagner

has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the Southwest quarter of Section three and the Lots five, six, seven, nine, ten, eleven, and twelve of Section ten in Township seventeen north of Range one west of the Seward Meridian, Alaska, containing two hundred seventy-nine and twelve-hundredths acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said claimant the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, iaws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way, thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States. And there is also reserved to the United States & Fight of way for the construction of railroads, telegraph and telephone lines, in accordance with the fict of March 12, 1914 (38 Stat., 305).
