Our office has found some discrepancies with this ROW and would like you to comment on how to go about resolving the issue. We have determined that a legal ROW for the Alaska Highway crossing Stephan Northway's allotment does not exist.

Enclosed you will find documents relating to the ROW for the Alaska Highway

that cross over Stephan Northway's Native Allotment.

First of all, the right of way description depicted in metes and bounds does not close. This ROW was recorded in the Fairbanks Recording District, Book 439, page number 168.

According to the Report of Investigation submitted to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for this particular ROW with the State, I have found that the ROW for the realignment is pursuant to PLO 1613 and the Alaska Omnibus Act Pub. L. 86-70, 73 Stat., 141. I disagree.

My research finds that the Alaska Highway was approved by President Roosevelt on February 11, 1942 and construction began on March 8, 1942. If you refer to the Relation Back Doctrine, Mr. Northway's use and occupancy began before the approval and construction of the Alaska Highway. Mr. Northway's use and occupancy began August 10, 1930 according to his Native Allotment application. This is 12 years before approval and construction of the Alaska Highway began; and it was also before PLO 1613 and the Alaska Omnibus Act.

Tanana Chiefs Conference is a unified voice advancing Tribal governments, economic and social development, promoting physical and mental wellness, educational opportunities and protecting language, traditional and cultural values.

If you have any documentation proving that our office is wrong in this determination, please contact us. We would like to get this ROW issue settled.
