On November 21, 1975, plaintiffs Curtis Ostrem and Steve Cox filed suit against the State of Alaska Department of Highways for damages and an injunction occasioned by the State of Alaska's entry upon their land to improve Nelson Plack Road. At the time of entry, the State of Alaska was in error and admittedly without legal right to enter, there having been no easements or condemnation accomplished. There additionally appeared to be no dispute as to the nature of the trespass. The law on trespass is relatively clear: a trespass, even if innocent, still entitles the owner of the land to recover for damages occasioned to the land by virtue of the trespass. Recognizing the potential exposure and liability of the State in this action, it was deemed wise to settle this action if a reasonable settlement could be achieved.

This memorandum is to confirm the settlement reached in the suit against the State of Alaska by Curtis Ostrem and Steve Cox, Civil Action Number 751377, which was filed on November 21, 1975, pursuant to a stipulation for The agreed upon sum of \$1,560.00 settlement attached hereto. is considered to be a quite just and equitable sum based on Highway Department estimates of crop damage done to the plaintiff's property coupled with inevitable court costs and attorney's fees which would flow from failure to prevail by virtue of trespass. Because the element of trespass was not in issue by the State, the case resolved itself solely into an assessment of damages. Following extensive investigations and negotiations by Larry Soden for the Department of Highways and myself, the sum of \$1,560.00 as a lump sum settlement was achieved. Had this case been carried to trial, it is quite possible that the loss to the State could have been substantially in excess of the agreed upon settlement.

Mr. Soden is to be complimented for his perseverance and diligence in both his investigation and, perhaps more importantly, in his ability to negotiate with individuals.
