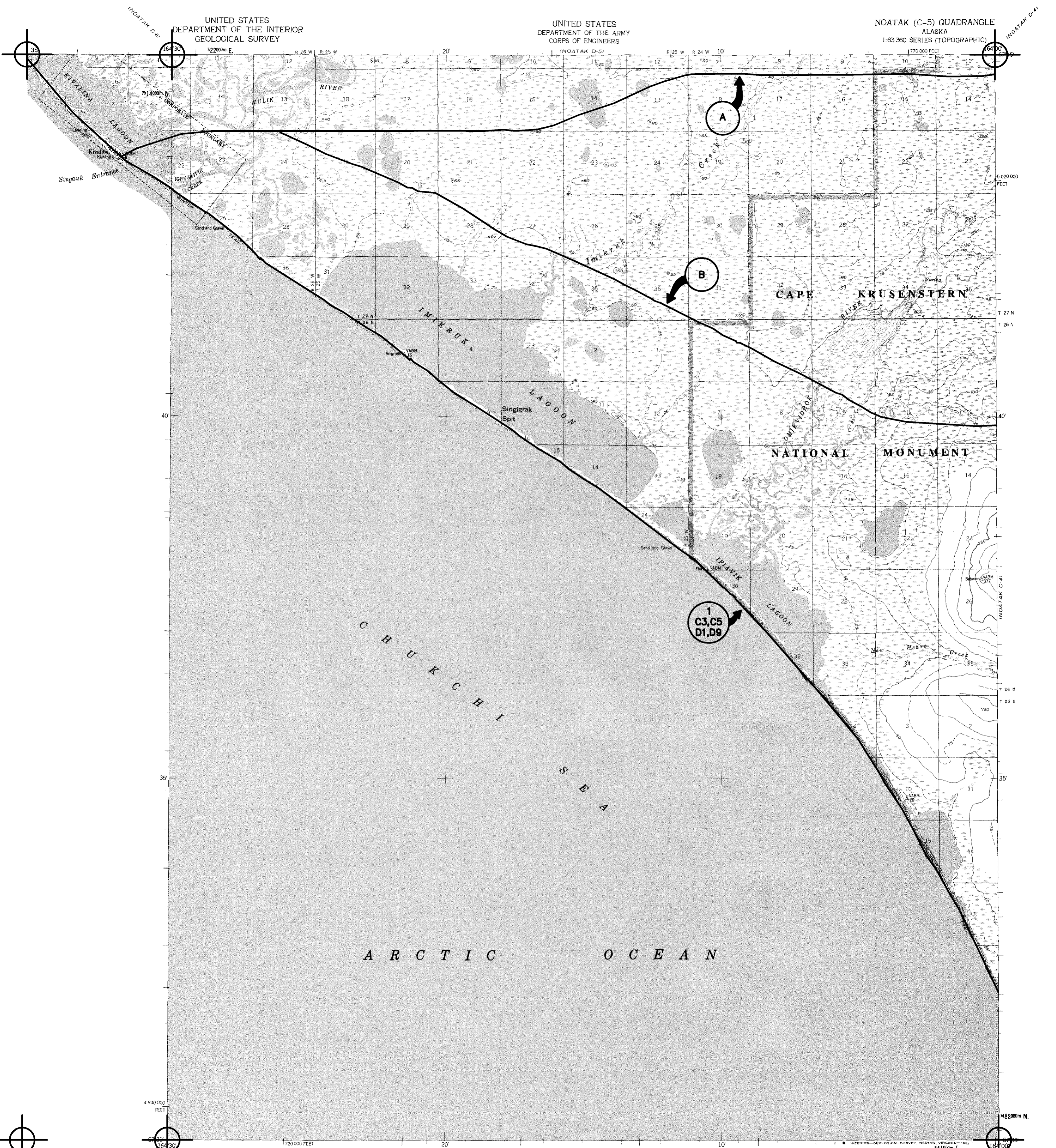

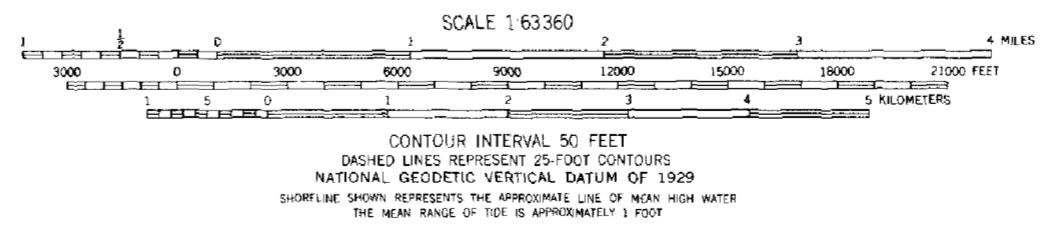

Universal Transverse Mercator projection, 1927 North American datum 10,000-foot grid based on Alaska coordinate system, zone 8 1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 3, shown in blue  
Gray land lines represent unsurveyed and unmarked locations predetermined by the Bureau of Land Management Folio R-4, Kateel River Meridian  
Swamps, as portrayed, indicate only the wetter areas, usually of low relief, as interpreted from aerial photographs  
The Alaska Maritime National Wildlife Refuge consists of all public lands in the coastal waters and adjacent seas of Alaska consisting of islands, islets, rocks, reefs, capes and spires  
There may be private inholdings within the boundaries of the National or State reservations shown on this map  
To place on the predicted North American Datum, 1983 move the projection lines 17 meters north and 127 meters east
