## CERTIFICATE

I, ROBERT W. WARD, SECRETARY OF STATE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA, DO HEREBY CERTIFY THAT, in accordance with the provisions of AS 29.10.022 an election for the incorporation of a fourth class city known as Kivalina, Alaska, was held on June 10, 1969, within the boundaries of said proposed area for incorporation and that a majority of votes were cast for incorporation. The vote was 49 for and 1 against.

AND THAT a majority of the votes were cast for enactment of a 2% sales tax. The vote was 41 for and 8 against.

I DO FURTHER CERTIFY THAT the city of Kivalina is incorporated as a fourth class city with a 2% sales tax;

THAT it possesses all the powers and privileges prescribed for cities of the fourth class by Title 29 of the ALASKA STATUTES;

THAT the boundaries of the said city are:

Beginning at Corner no. 1, which bears N 89° 00' E 1.940 miles from U.S.L.M. No. 2246; thence by metes and bounds:

S 42° 00' W 1.30 miles to Corner No. 2  
N 48° 00' W 3.20 miles to Corner No. 3  
N 42° 00' E 1.30 miles to Corner No. 4  
S 48° 00' E 3.20 miles to Corner No. 1

the true point of beginning, containing 4.16 square miles, more or less.

AND THAT on June 10, 1969, the following were elected as councilmen on the initial city council:

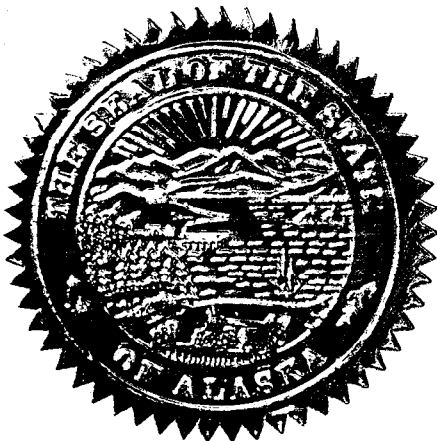
AND THAT the term of this office is to be one year unless determined otherwise by the city council.
