Replying to your letter "M" FTL of April 6, 1914, we have the honor to transmit herewith the papers filed in this office in connection with original homestead applications 0327 and 0328. These applications are made under the Act of March 3, 1903, and cover privately surveyed tracts. We were not sure as to the exact method to be pursued in the matter of final proof under this act, but we accepted the papers as filed, allowed the application, and had intended, after publication, to transmit the record entire (but without issuing final certificate) for your examination and instructions.

The failure to note the acreage on the schedule of allowances was an oversight, and pains will be taken to prevent recurrence. Fees and commissions to be applied at the ond of the month often mount to but very small sums, and we have in the past allowed the same to accumulate for several months be-


fore applying same. At times the Register or Receiver, or possibly both officers, are absent from Fairbenks for extended periods in connection with their duties as Clerk of U. S. District Court and U. S. Marshal, respectively. We can, however, prepare vouchers in blank, to be filled in at the end of the month for amounts to be applied, and in future shall apply all earned moneys at the end of each month.
