Trail Location
The Shaw Creek Lodge-Tenderfoot Creek Trail Begins North of the
Richardson Highway at Shaw Creek Lodge. From Shaw Creek Lodge the
Trail Runs Northwestward, Crossing Shaw Creek and A Ridge, and Then
Continues Southwestward To Tenderfoot Creek. the Trail Crosses
Tenderfoot Creek and Terminates at the Richardson Highway. the Route
Is Located in the USGS 1:63,360 Big Delta B-5 Quadrangle and Is
Approximately 3.5 Miles Long.
