



My dear Mr. Taylor:

Attached is a signed copy of the memorandum of understanding relating to the construction of the Turnagain Arm Road project in Alaska. This copy is for your files.

Vernon Northrop raised some question about the adequacy of the provisions in this memorandum for controlling the expenditures of funds. I am going to discuss this matter with his office, and if I get any ideas which may be helpful, I will pass them on to you.

In looking over the submittal to Congress for last year. I noticed that under "Maintenance" in listing the road systems the Richardson Highway is indicated as being 368 miles in length. Under the heading of "Construction" asphalt surfacing of the Richardson Highway is indicated as 365 miles in length. These figures are substantially the same and make no practical difference. However, if a Congressman was antagonistic to the program and could pick up discrepancies such as this, he could make the hearing more difficult. We noticed some of these discrepancies prior to the hearings last year but have always forgotten to check with you to see which figures were correct at times you were here.

My dear Mr. MacDonald:

This will reply to your letter of July 7 concerning the bids submitted for the construction of Sections C. D. E. El. E2, E3 and F1 for grading and bridges on the Seward-Anchorage Highway (Turungain Arm), Third Judicial District, Territory of Alaska.

In view of the fact that the low bid was considerably above the estimated cost of this section of the road, we discussed the matter in detail with Senator Guy Cordon, Chairman of the Interior Subcommittee of the Senate Appropriations Committee, and Ben Jensen, Chairman of the Interior Subcommittee of the House Appropriations Committee. Both of these men were disappointed to hear that the low bid was considerably in excess of the estimated cost of this road. However, both felt that it was necessary that we exercise our own judgment on the matter and that if in our opinion this was the best bid we could get it would be well to go shead with the project.

In light of the discussions we have held with you and Mr. Bright, it appears that the low bid by Lytle and Green is the best that we can do on this project. Therefore, I suggest that you go sheed and award the bid to them. I am sending your 1980 to Mr. Taylor for processing.

It is my hope that we will be able to get lower bids on the remaining two sections of the road and thus effect some saving that can be applied to the first section.



My dear Mr. Davis:

As a result of the January 9, 1945 request of Mr. B. W. Thoron, former Director, Division of Territories and Island Possessions, bids were opened in Portland, Oregon on June 29, 1948 by Public Roads Administration Division Engineer for the construction of Sections C. D. E. El. E2, E3 and F1 for grading and bridges on the Seward-Anchorage Highway (Turnagain Arm), Third Judicial District, Territory of Alaska.

The following firms submitted proposals:

- 1. Lytle Construction Co. & Green Construction Co.
- 2. Stock & Grove Inc.
- Peter Kiewit Sons! Co., S. Birch & Sons Construction Co. & Morrison-Knudsen Co., Inc.
- 4. M. P. Munter & Alton V. Phillips

As per tabulation of bids (2 copies attached), Lytle Construction Co. & Green Construction Co. further offered a 10 percent reduction if awarded all sections which made them low bidder.

It is to be noted that no bid was received for the erection of the bridge on Section E2 which necessarily eliminates consideration of construction of Sections E1 and E3. The Lytle and Green Construction Co. of Des Moines and Sioux City, Iowa were the low bidders on the combined sections. Their bid for the project including furnishing steel with concrete decks for bridges amounted to \$4,283,992.26, with the same sections with timber decks the low bid was \$4,141,587.24 a difference of \$142,405.02.

Since the concrete decks have a longer life and are more resistant to fire we believe that the concrete decks are a better buy.

After a discussion with the contractors, it is apparent that the prices for roadway items are reasonable under the circumstances though we questioned the prices of concrete and creosoted timber and after some discussion the contractors have advised that they are willing to eliminate these items as far as possible if by redesign, steel can be substituted to a cost advantage to the project.

The contractors also advised that there was considerable additional cost due to the closing of the Port of Whittier for freight to this project and routing through Seward. The contractors are now estimating the tonnage involved and will submit it for your consideration and will allow a rebate for any charges in railroad freight rates that can be granted.

These modifications need not interfere with the award of contract since contractors have agreed to adjustments by necessary supplemental agreements and since it is necessary to proceed at once if the contract is to be completed within the time limit of December 31, 1949 immediate action is necessary.

Public Roads Administration is prepared to award these contracts immediately in compliance of the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding and request that you make available sufficient authorization for such action including 10 percent for contingencies and 5 percent for engineering and the allocation of possibly \$2,500,000 cash which should be sufficient to carry the project for this fiscal year.

Attached is a reestimation of Sections C, D, E and F in the light of these prices and Section G as originally estimated.







Concerning the Turnagain Arm project, the following is quoted from a communication received from the Division of Territories and Island Possessions:

"As a result of discussions between representatives of the Alaska Railroad and the Public Roads Administration, it has been agreed that The Alaska Railroad will assume responsibility for survey and construction of the road between Potter and Indian and that the Public Roads Administration will assume responsibility for the survey between Indian and Mile 58 and construction between Portage and Mile 58, the remainder of the construction work to be allocated at a later date. A proposed Memorandum of Understanding between the Alaska Road Commission, The Alaska Railroad and the Public Roads Administration is being worked up here. It will outline the points that have been agreed to as of the present time and indicate the areas for future decision. There will be a paragraph dealing with 'reports' in the Memorandum of Understanding. Specific details as to the type of reports required will not be included. It may be that you will wish to obtain copies of the allotment ledger used by the Public Roads Administration which would give you detailed information, or the report as to status of funds could be rendered to you on a Form 3 by both Public Roads and The Alaska Reilroad. It is thought best to leave the specific details of the type of report which would meet your control needs to your decision."

For the present, will you please advise us at the end of each month the total obligations you have created against this appropriation, whether paid or outstanding? We would like very much to have the report for the period ending June 30th reach us not later than July 6th. Thereafter, it may reach us by the 10th of the month following the period for which report is made, though preferably earlier.

Also, for the period ending June 30th, will you please advise us of your expenditures and obligations by classification? The Alaska Road Commission usually employs 13 classifications (objects of expenditure), 1 to 13 inclusive, as set up in Regulation No. 1 relating to apportionment and reports on status of appropriations under Executive Order No. 8512 of August 13, 1910. However, if others are necessary, they may be used.

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

The appropriation for the construction of the Turnagain Arm Road is to the Alaska Road Commission. The symbol number is 1471423. As you know, the appropriation provides for \$7,370,000 in cash available immediately and \$4,000,000 in contract authorization.

As a result of discussions between representatives of the Alaska Reilroad and the Public Roads Administration, it has been agreed that The Alaska Reilroad will assume responsibility for survey and construction of the road between Potter and Indian and that the Public Roads Administration will assume responsibility for the survey between Indian and Nile 58 and construction between Portage and Mile 58, the remainder of the construction work to be allocated at a later date. A proposed Memorandum of Understanding between the Alaska Road Commission. The Alaska Railroad and the Public Boads Administration is being worked up here. It will outline the points that have been agreed to as of the present time and indicate the areas for future decision.

The mechanics of reimbursing or advancing funds for this construction have been largely worked out between the Fublic Roads Admin-istration and this office. Seventy-five thousand dollars have been paid directly to the Fublic Roads Administration here to support the survey parties which they now have in operation. All the rest of the cash evailable, \$7,295,000. has been transferred to the Disbursing Officer in Juneau for expenditure under your direction. In order to relieve the Road Commission of the details of paying vouchers submitted by contractors of the Railroad and PRA it will be provided in the proposed Memorandum of Understanding that the Reilroad and the Public Roads Administration will pay vouchers directly on work for which they are responsible. In the case of the Public Roads



The Memorendum of Understanding being prepared deals only with the Turnagain Arm project. We should be giving immediate thought, however, to a Memorendum of Understanding between the Road Commission and the Public Roads Administration outlining the procedures for handling the funds expected in the 1949 appropriation. Pertinent points in such a memorandum should include (1) review by the Alaska Road Commission of all specifications prior to advertisement for bids and review of all bids prior to award of contract; (2) a provision limiting the percentage of project funds that may be used for surveys by Public Roads Administration; (3) a provision specifying a percentage of funds which will be available to the Alaska Road Commission for necessary engineering overhead; (4) specific procedures on financing the projects. (For example, where several projects are involved it may be desirable to retain all funds for construction under the control of the Alaska Road Commission. Contractors would route vouchers to you and you would pay the vouchers after review. This procedure is different from that provided for in the proposed memorandum on the Turnagain Arm project, which will provide for an advance or reimbursement of funds to Public Roads and the Railroad and requires that they pay contractors vouchers directly).

I would greatly appreciate your thoughts on a general Memorandum of Understanding with the Public Roads Administration for use in connection with 1949 funds.

As the proposed legislation transferring the Alaska Road Commission to the Public Roads Administration has not been enacted by Congress, the Department is taking the position that the Alaska Road Commission should spearhead and coordinate the present road





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

HELATING TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE TURN GAIN ALL FOAD PROJECT IN ALASKA

Pursuant to the provisions of the "Irst Deficiency Appropriation Act, 19h8, approved May 10, 19h8 (Public Law 519 - 80th Congress), and in accord with conferences between officials concerned, the Alaska Boad Commission, and the Public Boads Administration, have arranged for the construction of a road designated as the "Turnagein Arm Project", hereinefter referred to as the Project, to provide a facility to comment the Menal Peninsula with the central road system of Alaska, the work to be performed under the following terms and commissions:

- 1. All funds for the Project, which have been made available under said act of May 10, 19h0, or from any future appropriations that may be made by Congress for the purpose, will be transferred to the disbursing officer at Juneau, Alaska, except that the sum of \$75,000 shall be transferred immediately to the Public Reads Administration through the U.S. Disbursing Officer in Machington for use in commention with surveys new in progress.
- 2. The U. S. Diebursing Officer at Juneau shall Edvance all necessary funds to be expended bersunder by the Public Roads Administration upon request of that organization and cortification of the Chief Engineer of the Almaka Road Commission. The said diebursing

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officer shall, at the option of the Alaska Mailroad, either advance or reinburse the Mailroad the funds necessary to cover all expenditures made or to be made by the Mailroad on the Project upon certification of the Chief Engineer of the Alaska Hoad Commission. The Public Reads Administration and the Railroad shall pay all vouchers and make all disbursements for the work performed by each of them hereunder; and the funds necessary for the purpose shall be transferred to these agencies by the Alaska Road Commission either in advance of such payment or by way of reimbursement after payment therefor shall have been made, as may be requested by the Public Roads Administration or the Hailroad, respectively.

- 3. The Mailroud shall be paid the cost of grading and structures necessary for both the railroad and the highway for that portion of the Project between Potter and Indian. It is understood, however, that the cost of placing any new rails and ties shall be borne entirely by the Mailroad and shall not be a charge against the funds appropriated for the Project.
- h. The Alaska Reilroad will be paid out of Project funds for changes in the telephone and telegraph lines made necessary by Project construction.
- 5. It is understood that no portion of the funds for the Project shall be used to reliaburse forest road funds expended on surveys of the proposed routes around Turnagain Arm made prior to May 10, 1968

- 6. No contract shall be untered into by either the Alaska Railroad or the Public Reads Administration for work, materials, or equipment for the Project under the contract authorisation provision contained in the act of May 10, 1948, unless specific authorization therefor shall first be given by the Alaska Road Commission.
- 7. Monthly reports shall be made to the Alaska Read Commission by The Alaska Reliroad and the Public Scade Administration. These reports shall include the following information: (1) total expenditures and obligations and purposes for which spent and/or obligated; (2) work progress during the south; and (3) estimated work progress in mext south. The specific details of the reports shall be worked out by the Alaska Road Commission, The Alaska Railroad, and the Public Roads Administration.
- 8. There shall be left for future determination by the parties hereto the question of whether the Railroad or Project funds shall bear any additional costs that may result from railroad improvements or increased costs of the highway between Indian and Portage in the event the highway is limited to the location within or adjacent to the railroad right-of-way between those points.
- 9. The Alaska Hailroad shall assume responsibility for location, survey, design, specifications, estimates, and supervision of contractors' operations with respect to the portion of the road between

Potter and Indian: Provided, That all plans, specifications, and estimates for the construction work shall be submitted to the Fublic Roads Administration for review and approval before advertisingifor bids. The Public Roads Administration shall designate a representative to maintain listeon with the Railroad in the location survey, and design phases of this portion of the Project.

- Dility for the location survey, design, specifications, and estimates for that portion of the road between Indian and Portage. The construction work shall be undertaken by either the Alaska Bailroad or the Public Boads Administration as may be determined by the parties hereto upon completion of the survey, design, specifications, and estimates for said portion of the road. If the construction work for the section between Indian and Portage is assigned to the Public Boads Administration, all plans, specifications, and estimates shall be submitted to the Alaska Bailroad for review and approval before work on said section is advertised for bids. The Alaska Bailroad shall designate a representative to maintain limison with the Public Boads Administration in the location survey, and design phases of this portion of the Project.
- 11. Alternate plans, specifications, and estimates shall be prepared by the Public Roads Administration for the location of be Project (1) around the head of Turnagain Arm to Portage, and) for the construction of a bridge across Turnagain Arm from a

point near the mouth of Quarta Greek to a point at or near Railroad Mile 67. Proposals will be requested on both of those routes but no contract shall be awarded therefor without the prior approval of The Alaska Patiroad and the Alaska Road Considerion.

12. As soon as practicable after funds are made available, the Public Reads Administration shall proceed with the work on the initial continu of the Project from Mile 58 to a point in the vicinity of the mouth of Quarts Creek on the senth side of Turangain Arm. All contracts for this section will be swarded by the Public Reads Administration which a gency will supervise all construction work thereon.

ALASKA ROAD LINK APPROVED

Secretary of the Interior J. A. Krug announced today that construction of matter about 50 miles of highway around Turnagain Arm at the head of the Kenai Peninsula in Alaska will open for development a hitherto inaccessible area which is rich in agricultural, mining and timber resources.

Invitation will be issued early in June for bids on the highway under an appropriation of \$11,370,000 included in the First Deficiency Act of 1948. The road will connect with an existing highway from Seward to Hope and a road down the northern shore of Turnagain Arm from Anchorage. Other roads, now partially built on the Peninsula, will make access possible to the rich mining and agricultural areas of Homer, as well as other agricultural areas around Ninilchik, Kasilof, Kenai and Nikishka.

Economic transportation will be provided by the new highway link for mineral, lumber and farm products and ports and it is expected to lead to the development of great timber resources in the Kenai area. Aside from its industrial importance, the road will make it possible for tourists and sportsmen to reach the Kenai Peninsula's game fishing and hunting areas with greater ease.

The appropriation for the road will be administered by the Alaska Road Commission, an agency of the Department of the Interior. Construction will be handled cooperatively by the Public Roads Administration and the Alaska Railroad, also an agency of the Interior Department.
