RECORDS OF THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS

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#### INTRODUCTION

The Bureau of Public Roads had its beginnings in the Office of Road Inquiry established on October 3, 1893, by an order of the Secretary of Agriculture, under authority of the Agricultural Appropriation Act for the fiscal year 1894 (27 Stat. 737). This act appropriated \$10,000 "to enable the Secretary to make inquiries in regard to the systems of road management throughout the United States, to make investigations in regard to the best methods of road-making, to prepare publications on this subject suitable for distribution, and to enable him to assist the agricultural colleges and experiment stations in disseminating information on this subject."

Passage of the act resulted mainly from demands of the good-roads-movement groups that agitated in the 1880's and 1890's for Federal aid in improving existing roads and providing more efficient construction. Outstanding among these groups because they transformed local agitation for better roads into a national movement were the National League for Good Roads and the League of the American Wheelmen. Gen. Roy Stone, the civil engineer who had initiated the Good Roads Convention in Chicago in 1892 and who became the General Vice President of the National League for Good Roads, was selected by the Secretary of Agriculture as the Special Agent and Engineer to head the Office of Road Inquiry.

An antecedent, especially of the Bureau's investigative role, can be traced to the Commissioners of Agriculture, Isaac Newton and Horace Capron, whose annual reports for 1866 and 1868, respectively, contained studies of rural road conditions and suggested improvements in road construction and management. Some of the functions of the Bureau of Public Roads may also be traced to the first efforts of the Federal Government to aid highway construction—the appointment of a Commission on March 9, 1806, to supervise the construction of the "Old Cumberland Road."

The Office of Road Inquiry had no independent statutory basis but existed solely by virtue of annual appropriation acts. It had several changes in name, organization, and functions through the years. From 1893 until 1912 its functions were those of investigation and education only. At first it disseminated information almost wholly through publications, lectures, and consultations, but in 1896 it began to encourage the construction of object-lesson roads, financed locally and built under the supervision of its engineers, to demonstrate the value and methods of building good roads. Although building these roads was to remain the Office's most important function until 1912, it also built other experimental roads in order to increase the scientific knowledge of roadbuilding; the first one, made of steel, was built in 1898. During the fiscal year 1899 the Office's name was changed to the Office of Public Roads Inquiries.

In 1895 the Office began to conduct tests on roadmaking materials, and in 1900 a laboratory for testing these materials was set up in cooperation with the Bureau of Chemistry.

On July 1, 1905, by authority of the Agricultural Appropriation Act for the fiscal year 1906 (33 Stat. 882) the Division of Tests of the Bureau of Chemistry and the Office of Public Roads Inquiries were consolidated under the name of the Office of Public Roads. The functions of the Office remained unchanged, but the work was divided among three general divisions—Highways, Laboratory Tests and Investigations, and Information. A Subdivision of Special Advice and Inspection handled the numerous requests for advice from State and local road authorities; by 1907 its work had expanded to include the preparation of plans and estimates for model county—road systems. A system of apprenticeship training in road engineering for civil engineering graduates and for materials laboratory technicians was also developed. In 1909 the Office entered a new field of research when it began economic and statistical investigations to determine the status of road improvement and, later, its economic effect on communities. In 1910 a Division of Bridges and Culvert Engineering was added.

The appropriation act for the Post Office Department for the fiscal year 1913 (37 Stat. 551) authorized \$500,000 "to be expended by the Secretary of Agriculture in cooperation with the Postmaster General in improving the condition of roads to be selected by them over which rural delivery is or may hereafter be established . . Provided, That the State or the local subdivision thereof in which such improvement is made under this provision shall furnish double the amount of money for the improvement of the road or roads so selected." This act is significant in that it marks the reentrance of the Federal Government into the field of public roadbuilding, an activity which it had abandoned after 1857.

The Agricultural Appropriation Act for the fiscal year 1916 (39 Stat. 471) combined the Divisions of Drainage and Irrigation of the Office of Experiment Stations and the farm architectural work of the Office of Farm Management Investigations with the Office of Public Roads, under the new title of Office of Public Roads and Rural Engineering. The Office was composed of two divisions that had been added to the Office of Public Roads in 1914—Road Maintenance and National Park and Forest Roads, and the following divisions: Road Construction, Road Economics, Road Material Tests and Research, Farm Irrigation Investigations, Drainage Investigations, and Rural Engineering. In 1921 the last three of these divisions became sections of the new Division of Agricultural Engineering. On July 1, 1931, in accordance with the Agricultural Appropriation Act for the fiscal year 1932 (46 Stat. 1266), the Division of Agricultural Engineering was given bureau status and its records and functions were transferred from the Bureau of Public Roads.

With the passage of the Federal-Aid Road Act of 1916 (39 Stat. 355) the Office became a roadbuilder on a large scale. The act appropriated \$75 million, available over a period of 5 years, to enable the Secretary of Agriculture to cooperate with the States, through their respective highway departments, in the construction, reconstruction, or improvement of public roads over which the U. S. mails were or might be transported. More important was the requirement that each State sharing in the appropriation must first establish a State highway department adequate, in the opinion of the Secretary of Agriculture, to cooperate with him. also prescribed a definite mathematical formula for apportioning Federal aid among the States. After administrative expenses had been deducted the remainder was to be divided among the States according to area, population, and mileage of rural delivery routes, each factor having a weight of one-third. Each State was required to pay at least half the cost incurred in the Federal-State cooperative roadbuilding. The act also appropriated \$10 million, at the rate of \$1 million a year for the survey, construction, and maintenance-under the supervision of the Secretary of Agriculture -- of highways within or partly within the national forests. The Office, however, had already performed some work relating to national forest highways as well as to national park roads.

The administration of this act so broadened the scope of the Office that an entire reorganization was necessary. Its activities were divided between two large branches, the Engineering Branch and the Management and Economics Branch. The field work was organized into 10 districts, each under a district engineer. Through its district organizations the Office had direct contact with State highway departments. The district offices reviewed all documents submitted by the States, including construction programs, project statements, plans, specifications and estimates, contracts, and final construction reports. Differences between the States and the Office were settled by the district offices, with appeal to Washington. The area of these districts varied from year to year and from January 1947 until December 1956 they were called divisions. At present they are called regions.

With the outbreak of World War I the operation of the Federal-Aid Road Act was curtailed. After the war the Bureau of Public Roads, so named in the Agricultural Appropriation Act for the fiscal year 1919 (40 Stat. 1000) was given increased appropriations under an amendment of February 28, 1919 (40 Stat. 1201), and began operations on a large scale. In accordance with the Post Office Appropriation Act for the fiscal year 1920 (40 Stat. 1201), a War Materials Division was created in the Bureau to distribute to the States surplus war materials that could be used in road work.

The Federal Highway Act of 1921 (42 Stat. 212) retained the outstanding features of the Federal-Aid Road Act of 1916 and added the important requirement that the Secretary of Agriculture and the

several State highway departments should jointly designate a system of important interstate and intercounty roads (limited to 7 percent of the country's total road mileage) to constitute the Federal-aid highway system upon which all future Federal appropriations should be expended. For later laws, see the Bureau of Public Roads, Laws Relating to Federal Aid in Construction of Roads (1958).

The Bureau made some administrative changes to facilitate the working of the Federal-aid plan on a large scale. By 1923 the Bureau comprised the following divisions: Design, Construction, Highway Economics, Control, Bridge, War Materials, Equipment, Tests and Research, and Agricultural Engineering. After 1928, when the Divisions of Laws and Contracts, Information, and Management were added and the Divisions of War Materials and Equipment were abolished, the Bureau had the basic operational structure that it would retain for some time. When it was transferred to the Department of Commerce in 1949 the Bureau was composed of the Legal Department and the Departments of Construction and Maintenance, Design, Finance and Business Management, and Research.

The Federal Highway Act of 1921, as amended, had greatly increased the functions of the Bureau. It apportioned funds to the States according to a prescribed formula; it approved the selection of projects, plans, construction, and materials; and it supervised road construction in national forests and parks, public lands, and Federal reservations. Its original research activities were expanded to include studies on design, materials, highway surfaces and subgrades, costs, and maintenance. Divisions were set up to carry on research in highway transport, to conduct traffic surveys, and to disseminate information. The Bureau also helped the States to formulate highway laws, organize highway departments, and prepare specifications and standards for highways; and, in many cases, it set up laboratories to test materials for the States.

In 1930 the Bureau began its assistance to the Central American countries in constructing the Inter-American Highway. In this country the Bureau administered large emergency sums for employing relief labor on highways and for eliminating grade crossings and other hazards. The Federal-aid system was broadened to include urban improvements and secondary or farm-to-market roads. On July 1, 1939, under the President's Reorganization Plan I, the Bureau was transferred to the Federal Works Agency and its name was changed to the Public Roads Administration.

With the outbreak of World War II and the passage of the Defense Highway Act on November 19, 1941 (55 Stat. 765), all activities not required in the conduct of the war were discontinued. The Bureau's major efforts were directed to constructing access roads to war industries and military areas, building the Alcan Highway, correcting critical deficiencies in the network of strategic highways, and cooperating with the Central American countries in the improvement of the Inter-American Highway.

The Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1944 (58 Stat. 838) authorized a large postwar highway program, providing ample funds for the Federal-aid system, farm-to-market or secondary roads, and urban improvements. It specified that there be a National System of Interstate Highways not to exceed 40,000 miles. The Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1948 provided for the continuation of the program and authorized additional funds to carry it out.

On July 1, 1949, the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949 (63 Stat. 380) authorized the transfer of the Public Roads Administration to the General Services Administration and changed its name back to the Bureau of Public Roads. On August 20, 1949, the President's Reorganization Plan No. 7 became effective, and the Bureau was transferred to the Department of Commerce where it remains at the present time.

At the time of its transfer to the Department of Commerce the Bureau of Public Roads was primarily responsible for administering the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1948, providing for a cooperative program of improvement of primary, secondary, and urban highways in the United States and for the construction of roads in the national forests and parks and other Federal areas. The Bureau cooperated with Territorial and foreign governments in establishing long-range highway improvement programs, designing and constructing highways and bridges, and providing information on and instruction in various phases of highway engineering. The Bureau also carried on an extensive highway research program.

In carrying out the Bureau's functions, certain staff members reviewed overall State highway systems and programs submitted by the States as a framework within which the individual project applications were made and reviewed. Other staff members were responsible for setting construction and maintenance standards for all Federal-aid work, for gaging the progress of projects, for applying and using the latest technical methods, and for examining State-aid vouchers for technical adequacy. Research staff members conducted research and development in all aspects of highway and road construction, maintenance, and administration. Staff members were also concerned with the construction of roads in the national forests and parks and other Federal areas where the Bureau rather than the State was the direct contracting authority.

The records described in this inventory are the records of the Bureau of Public Roads and its predecessors that were in the National Archives on November 30, 1961. They are designated as Record Group 30. They amount to 3,277 cubic feet, including 213 cubic feet of photographic materials and 169 cubic feet of cartographic materials. The records date from 1893 to 1950, with a few records of earlier and later date. These records were created or accumulated by the central office of the Bureau of Public Roads and its predecessors. They consist chiefly of the

numeric-subject classified correspondence files and the letters sent files, 1893-1912; the decimal classified correspondence files, 1912-50; and miscellaneous materials, 1893-1950.

Related records in the National Archives are to be found in Record Group 16, Records of the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture; and in Record Group 162, General Records of the Federal Works Agency. Many of the records allocated to Record Group 8, Records of the Bureau of Agricultural Engineering, were once part of the central files of the Bureau of Public Roads. When the Division of Agricultural Engineering of the Bureau of Public Roads achieved Bureau status in 1931, all its functions and records were transferred from the Bureau of Public Roads. Classification groups of the central office files, such as 600 (Rural Engineering), 900 (Farm Irrigation Investigations), and 200 (Farm Drainage Investigations), were relatively easy to separate from the other central office files. Other groups of the central office files, however, such as 001 (Description of Work of the Office), were probably screened individually. Because of the difficulty of separating individually filed pieces of correspondence, some correspondence pertaining to the work of the Division of Agricultural Engineering is still interfiled in the central office files of the Bureau of Public Roads.

Related records outside the National Archives include the decimal classified correspondence files of the Bureau, 1950-55, which are at present located in the Federal Records Center, Alexandria, Va., and the currently maintained files of the Bureau. The personnel records of employees separated from the Bureau before December 31, 1951, are in the Federal Records Center, St. Louis, Mo.

The most useful publications relating to the administrative history of the Bureau of Public Roads are W. Stull Holt, The Bureau of Public Roads: Its History, Activities and Organization (Baltimore, 1923), and such agency publications as U.S. Bureau of Public Roads and Its Work (1930) and The Public Roads Administration and Its Work (1946). An unpublished master's thesis by William C. Hilles, "The Good Roads Movement in the United States: 1880-1916," (Duke University, 1958) gives an account of the agitation for good roads that brought about the establishment of the Office of Road Inquiry. Changes in organization and functions of the Bureau can be traced through the annual reports of the heads of the Bureau of Public Roads and its predecessors (1893-1960).

Entries describing cartographic records in this inventory were prepared by Charlotte M. Ashby. Entries describing photographic records were prepared by Truman R. Strobridge, with the cooperation of the Still Picture Branch.

Each card contains name of correspondent, date, and file number under which the correspondence is filed. Arranged in two subseries covering approximately the years 1892-1908 and 1908-12, and thereunder alphabetically by name of correspondent. DRANCES 1-8

1893-1912. 40 ft. GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE. Letters received and beginning about 1904 also copies of letters sent, together with related records such as reports, memoranda, and published material concerning the establishment of the Bureau of Public Roads, its overall administration, and its varied functions and activities, especially the building of object-lesson roads. The Bureau's correspondence with members of Federal and State legislative bodies, professional societies, State highway officials, associations for the promotion of good roads, and the general public reveals its efforts to gather and disseminate information concerning roads, model road systems, and roadbuilding, and to cooperate with legislators, private citizens, and Government agencies in promoting good roads and obtaining the necessary legislation to build them. There are some records dated as early as July 1890, which were accumulated by Gen. Roy Stone before he became the first head of the Office of Road Inquiry. Arranged according to a numeric-subject classification scheme which is reproduced in appendix I.

LETTERS SENT BY THE BUREAU. 1893-1904. 39 vols. 5 ft.

Press copies of letters sent dealing with all activities of the Bureau. Arranged chronologically. Each volume is indexed by name of correspondent.

NAME INDEX TO GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE. 1912-55. 375 ft.

Index on 3" x 5" cards or slips to what the indexer considered "important" letters and telephone conversations filed or recorded in entry 6. Given are the name of correspondent, dates of correspondence received and sent, the file classification, and usually the subject. From the beginning of the World War II period a rather detailed resume of each letter is also given. This index also served as a general directory of persons who did business with the Bureau. Arranged in overlapping subseries by fiscal year, thereunder alphabetically by name of correspondent, and thereunder chronologically. DRAWERS 9-257

correspondence with the district offices, 1919-45, giving dates of correspondence received and sent, file classification, and rarely the subject; arranged in overlapping subseries by fiscal year, thereunder chronologically; (2) "Division cards" indexing the central office correspondence with divisions (earlier called districts), 1945-55, giving dates of correspondence received and sent, file classification, and rarely the subject; arranged in overlapping subseries by fiscal year, thereunder chronologically; (3) a name index to the Highway Planning File (710.8), 1935-40, giving name of correspondent, dates of correspondence received and sent, file classification, and sometimes the subject; arranged in overlapping subseries by fiscal year, thereunder alphabetically, thereunder chronologically; (4) a claim file index of employees of the Bureau, 1935-50, giving name of employee, dates of correspondence with the U.S. Employees' Compensation Commission, and file number (321); arranged in overlapping subseries by fiscal year, thereunder chronologically; and (5) a material index file, not dated, giving type of road material and name and address of supplier; arranged alphabetically by type of road material, name of State, and name of supplier.

GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE AND RELATED RECORDS. 1912-50. 2,272 ft. This series, designed for the maintenance of all official correspondence of the Washington office, deals mainly with the role of the Bureau as the principal roadbuilder of the Federal Government and with the administration of Federal-aid funds to the States. The records consist mainly of correspondence, memoranda, and reports but also include records of telephone conversations, photographs, maps, and statistical and published materials. Included also are copies of letters sent and received by the field offices, which were forwarded to the Washington office; and records transferred in bulk by different units of the Washington office, which were filed -- without further arrangement -- under one file number. Although the Division of Agricultural Engineering became an independent bureau and took its separately maintained records with it, much of its correspondence remains in this series because of the difficulty of separating individually filed pieces. Arranged by a modified Dewey classification system (see appendix II).

Office Files and Correspondence Concerning Particular Bureau Activities

OFFICE FILES OF CAPT. P. ST. J. WILSON, CHIEF ENGINEER. 1916-34.

Mainly copies of circulars, memoranda, letters, and reports accumulated by Captain Wilson, which relate chiefly to his dealings with district engineers. Arranged in two subseries: (1) Notebooks containing chiefly copies of circulars, memoranda, and letters sent by Captain Wilson to the district engineers concerning the performance of their duties, with enclosures such as copies of letters received by the Bureau, photographs, published pamphlets, charts, and drawings. Included also are circulars sent to the district engineers by other Bureau officials, as well as

A photoprocessed map annotated by the Office of Public Roads to show settled and unsettled areas, high and low alluvial areas, and courses of roads.

MAP OF FLORIDA. 1918. 1 item.

A photoprocessed map that was prepared in the Office of Public Roads and Rural Engineering to show the progress of the economic highway survey of the State.

"HISTORICAL" MAP. 1927. 1 item.

A published map of North America from Nicaragua north to the southern tip of Lake Michigan showing Spanish Caminos Reales, routes followed by French and Spanish explorers, and Indian trails for the period 1519-1821. This map was compiled in the Bureau from original and other sources.

"ASSEMBLY" MAPS OF THE FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY SYSTEMS. 1922. 2 items.

Two maps of the United States annotated to show the original tentative Federal-aid highway systems as submitted by the States. One map shows primary roads only, and the other shows both primary and secondary roads.

MAPS OF HIGHWAY SYSTEMS. 1922-60. 1 in. 54 items.

Published maps of the United States showing the Federal-aid highway system, the United States system of numbered highways, interstate highways, and defense highways. There is also a copy of a map, dated 1922, showing the project for the development of national highways approved by Gen. John J. Pershing, Chief of Staff. This map is retained as a record of the Bureau because it represents the basic highway study that eventually led to the adoption of the national system of interstate and defense highways authorized by the 1956 Federal-Aid Highway Act. Arranged by subject and thereunder by edition date.

PROGRESS MAP. 1930. 1 item.

A map of the United States annotated to show the progress of construction of the principal interstate highways. Colors differentiate the types of material used to surface the highways.

MAP SHOWING KINDS OF ROAD CONSTRUCTION. 1920. 1 item. 26

A map of the United States annotated with graphic symbols to show for each State the percentage of earth roads, macadam and other intermediatetype roads, and concrete and other high-type roads.

MAP SHOWING SUBGRADES. ca. 1928-32. 1 item.

A photoprocessed map of the United States showing prevailing subgrades by soil types.

MAPS OF TOLL ROADS. 1953-55. 2 items.

Published maps of the United States showing completed roads, those under construction, and those authorized.

MAP ANNOTATED BY PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT TO SHOW PROPOSED EXPRESS HIGHWAYS. 1938. 1 item. 29

A map of the United States annotated with blue lines. An attached note states that President Franklin D. Roosevelt personally drew these lines on the map to show routes on which express highways should be built.

MAP SHOWING PUBLIC WORKS HIGHWAY PROJECTS. 1934. 1 item. 30

A map of the United States annotated to show the locations of public works highway projects programed for improvement with a \$400 million grant to the States provided under section 204 of the National Industrial Recovery Act.

TRAFFIC FLOW CHARTS. 1937-52. 5 items.

Published maps of the United States showing by lines of varying width the average number of cars carried daily by the major highways during 1937-52. Included is a similar map diagraming truck and bus traffic patterns for 1938.

MAPS RELATING TO SNOW-REMOVAL PROGRAMS. 1920-30. 7 items. 32

A reprint by the Bureau of a Weather Bureau map of the United States showing by area the average annual number of days with snow cover; published maps of the United States showing the main highways on which snow was to be removed, 1925-30; and photoprocessed maps of northeastern United States showing roads proposed for snow clearance, 1920-23.

MAP SHOWING MOTOR TRUCK SHIPMENTS OF ORANGES FROM FLORIDA AND CALIFORNIA. 1950. 1 item. 33

A photoprocessed map of the United States showing by State the number of carlot equivalents of oranges shipped by motor truck from California and from Florida. A heavy line divides the area where shipments from Florida predominate from the area where shipments from California predominate.

MAPS OF THE WESTERN STATES. 1921-46. 34 items.

Photoprocessed and annotated maps of the 11 western States showing proposed, approved, and existing Federal-aid primary and secondary highways and highways administered by the Forest Service. The status of construction on the existing roads is indicated. One of the maps is annotated to show defense, mineral, and timber access roads as of March 1945.

Published maps of the United States showing the status of the

STATE TRANSPORTATION MAPS. 1936-47. 657 items. 4 in.

Published maps of States, each on two or more sheets, showing highways, railroads, canals, air lanes, and dredged channels. Federal aid and State highway systems are differentiated, and the type of pavement is shown. Arranged alphabetically by name of State and thereunder by edition date.

STATE MAPS SHOWING FOUR-LANE FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAYS. 1939-41. 52 items.

Annotated to show status of construction of and proposed locations for four-lane highways. These maps were prepared by the State highway departments at the request of the Bureau of Public Roads. Arranged alphabetically by name of State.

STATE MAPS SHOWING PROGRESS OF THE FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY SYSTEM. 1925-39.

### Records of the Highway Traffic Advisory Committee to the War Department

This Committee was organized in November 1940 to advise the Secretary of War on highway transport matters and to ensure that essential action was taken by State agencies to meet the highway transportation needs of the War Department. Thomas H. MacDonald, Commissioner of Public Roads, was chairman of the Committee, which included representatives of the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, and the American Association of State Highway Officials. After April 1942 a full-time Director and a small staff were employed. The United States was divided into transportation zones, and State and local committees were organized. The work of these committees was tied in with that of the national committee, largely through Federal liaison officers.


