Alaska Right-of-Way Problems

I agree with Mr. Christensen's memorandum of September 3 insofar as the need for instructions to the field is concerned. However, it is not felt that such instructions can be issued until certain legal questions have been determined. We are preparing a request to the General Counsel for rulings on the most pressing questions and when they are received we can advise Mr. Swick more definitely as to the procedures that should be followed. This is a situation where we will have to more or less feel our way along depending on the courts, comptroller general, and the office of the General Counsel to give us guidance since it is an unprecedented situation.

There is no doubt but that Mr. Swick needs someone in his office, who has a legal background, to assist him in getting this situation in hand. It is going to be a long hard struggle to bring any semblance of order to the existing right-of-way situation.





On March 28, 1956, the District Engineer, Alaska Road Commission (now the Bureau of Public Roads) filed with this Bureau an application (Fairbanks 013138) for the withdrawal of U.S. Survey No. 2285, located within section 30, T. 4 S., R. 4 E., Fairbanks Meridian, and containing 12 acres of public lands.

The tract, which straddles the Richardson Highway in the southwest corner of the old Salcha Military Reservation, some eight miles south of the Eielson Air Force Base and 35 miles southeast of Fairbanks, is to be utilized by the applicant for the construction of erosion and flood control structures. The Governor's office has made inquiry as to the status of construction on the Homer end of the Sterling Highway which was programmed for this season. It is greatly regretted that problems of right-of-way and fisheries would not permit initiation of the work this season.

In reply to your letter of July 17, 1957, to District Engineed M. C. Zimmerman, I wish to assure you that the next improvement of the Sterling Highway will start at Homer and proceed northward to join the paving at Soldotna. Funds have already been set aside from current allotments to perform the initial grading from Homer to Ninilchik, and there will be no change in these plans.

In the section from Homer to Ninilchik, 179 easements are required for right-of-way and 7 for gravel. A large percentage of the land owners have been more than cooperative, but it takes only a few to definitely block a project until legal procedures can take effect. We are following the necessary procedures, and it is then up to the courts as to how rapidly the decisions will be reached.

The Bureau of Public Roads cannot accede to payment of exorbitant prices for right-of-way or gravel and will resort to condemnation when faced with such demands. Appraisals will be made by disinterested parties, and on the basis of these appraisals the courts will be asked to set a price. We hope that these actions can be completed in time to start construction in 1958.





PERMIT OF ENTRY AND USE

The Alaska Communication System requires a well, water line, and access road in connection with the Northway A.C.S. Repeater Site. Portions of the water line and access road will traverse areas under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Public Roads.

The water line right-of-way, Tract "E", is to be 10 feet wide, 5 feet on either side of the following described centerline:

Commencing at the junction of the Alaska Highway, near Mile Post 1265, and the Airport Road in the Territory of Alaska; thence northwesterly 875 feet, more or less, along the centerline of said Alaska Highway; thence N. 57° 54' E., 32 feet, to Corner No. 1 of the land withdrawn by P.L.O. 765; thence N. 32° 06' W., 550 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning for this description; thence 5. 34° 00' W., 200 feet, more or less, to a point. 

Reference is made to your phone conversation of Thursday, March 30, concerning formal permits or letters of authority issued by the Alaska Road Commission to the Corps of Engineers covering the 8" pipeline from Haines to Fairbanks.

Under date of June 29, 1956, you rendered a preliminary opinion of title covering 8.92 acres of land, more or less, being acquired by the Alaska Boad Commission from Edgar L. and Lucy E. Law, in the Kenai Recording Precinct, Alaska, for use as a gravel pit and crusher site on the Sterling Highway, Alaska. Your department file number is 33-2-159.

Section 107 of the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1956 (70 Stat. 378) transferred the functions, duties, and authority pertaining to the construction, repair, and maintenance of reads, trammays, ferries, bridges, trails, and other works in Alaska, conferred upon the Department of the Interior and heretofore administered by the Secretary of Interior under the Act of June 30, 1932 (h? Stat. hhó; hö U.S.C., sec. 321s and following) to the Department of Commerce to be administered by the Secretary of Commerce or by such officer, or officers, as may be designated by him.

Your preliminary opinion of title listed seven requirements and objections that would have to be met before a clear title could be vected in the United States of America. The requirements are discussed individually below: Asquirement No. 1 excepts all taxes and assessments, including those referred to in Item 2, Schedule B, of the Preliminary Certificate of Title. There is enclosed a final Certificate of Title, No. 5682h, certified by the Title Insurance and Trust Company of Alaska, which does not show any exceptions and would seem to eliminate Requirement No. 1.

Requirement No. 2 requires a determination as to the rights or claims of persons in possession, if any, not shown of record. There are enclosed two "Jertificates of Inspection and Possession" covering the periods from July k, 1955 to July k, 1956, and from November 20, 1955, to November 20, 1955, which show that no one, other than the grantor, is in physical possession of the property.

Requirement No. 3 covers Mechanic's Liens, if any, not shown of record. The certificate referred to in Requirement 2 would seem to also cover Requirement No. 3.

Requirement No. 1 covers the easements for roads, highways and public utilities, if any, not shown of record; and the easement referred to at Item 6, Schedule B, of the Preliminary Certificate of Title. 

Alaska Right-of-Way Problems

Reference is made to the letter from the Territorial Highway Engineer, dated September 21, 1956, requesting answers to certain questions relative to right-of-way procedures in Alaska. Questions numbers 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 appear to apply directly to right-of-way matters. The answers are as follows:

- Question No. 3: The inclusion of the highway activities in Alaska within the Federal-aid program would be adequate "authority of the United States" for the former Alaska Roads Commission to take rights-of-way across private property as reserved by 18 USCA 321(d). The Organic Act would not seem to limit the activities in any manner.
- Question No. 4: Under the provisions of the Federal-Aid
 Highway Act of 1956, the Department of
 Commerce succeeded to all authority formerly
 vested in the Department of the Interior, and
 the Bureau of Public Roads would now have the
 right to take rights-of-way across public
 domain to the same extent that the Alaska Roads
 Commission formerly had such authority.
- Question No. 5: Actual title to the right-of-way for roads constructed and maintained with Federal-aid moneys would be vested in the United States of America.
- Question No. 6: Title to the right-of-way for roads constructed by the Federal Government and maintained with Federal-aid moneys would be in the name of the United States of America.
- Question No. 7: Title to the right-of-way for roads constructed by the Territory or municipalities and maintained with Federal-aid moneys would be vested in the Territory or the appropriate municipality.

The Chugach Electric Association is building a power distribution line to Girdwood and Portage. We are locating the main distribution line on Gold Avenue one block North of the Seward Highway, with branches in the alleys to serve domestic and commercial consumers. The poles will be located in the alley rights-of-way, but we are requesting an easement of ten feet on adjacent lots to allow for crossarm overhang and to permit us to clear dangerous trees and brush which may be in the path of the line. The poles and lines will clear any structures you may have within the right-of-way line.

The records of the Anchorage Land Office reveal that the Bureau of Public Roads has jurisdiction over lots 7 to 10, block 2, under Public Land Order 609, and lots 12 to 14, block 2, under an unnumbered executive order dated August 24, 1934. We have authority from the Bureau of Land Management, Anchorage serial 029885 to construct the power line on public lands provided we have clearance from other agencies having interest in any land along the route.

We are enclosing our standard easement for your convenience, but we will not object to your modification of it or substitution of a different form or permit so long as it authorizes the desired use. We hope we may hear from you at an early date concerning the easements requested.

This is to supplement the comments made at page 3 of said mesoranden with regard to Case So. L. The view that on entryman has an incheste right even against the United States is controversial. The early les appears contra. (Suscien-Jeorican Packing Scapery vs. United States, 19) U.S. 570; Frisbie vs. Whitney, 9 Wall. 187) Sudor these cases, it would seem that the United States could obtain gravel from Land as seeded, under valid entry, free of cost. However, we are adviced that, in a recent Alaska case involving application by the Corps of Engineers, the Pederal District Court hold that an entrymen was embitled to compensation. Although the Department of Justice did not appeal, we understand that it did not concede the legal position. An earlier opinion by the Department of the Interior (34 LD 155) indicated also that entry entable here goes right to compensation. Further, the Field Salicitor of the Department of the Interior at Sems, Neveda, concarning a Many acquisition for reclaration purposes, held that an entrycan in good signifing has a cooperasolic interest and is entitled to exer compensation in a condensation sait. The Selicitor held that the general property rights of an entrymen in his torpatented reclamation incertesal are similar to those of an untrysan under the general homestesd laws.

Under the directations, and because of the difficulty of determining the proper basis for compensation, if any, it would not be proper to purchase gravel from entryment. Bather, if compensation is claimed, the question should be resolved through a court proceeding.
