Submitted herewith is the draft of an Executive order which INTERIOR DEPTWILL withdraw the public land in an area containing 1,210,000 acres

MEMORANDUM for the Secretary.

INTERIOR PEPT

After careful study and consideration of the request of the 1941 War Department of October 29, 1940 to withdraw an area on Kenai SECRETARY Peninsula for the same purpose, which area was found to be important and valuable for the preservation of wildlife and other purposes, a substitute area was informally suggested at a conference between officials of the Fish and Wildlife Service and of the War Department, FROM SOL OF And was found acceptable to the War Department. This alternate area is the subject of the proposed order submitted herewith.

On June 20 the Office of Indian Affairs was informed of the proposed withdrawal of the alternate area, and this office has been informally advised that there is no objection thereto. The correspondence will be routed through that Office for endorsement. The proposed order excepts fishing villages and the Moquawkie Native Reservation at Tyonek, containing about 25,000 acres. There are 91.01 acres of patented mission and trade and manufacturing sites in the area to be withdrawn, and an outstanding coal prospecting permit embracing 287 acres.

> The records of this office show that the land for the most part is low and flat, and contains a large area of muskeg. more northern portions are mountainous, the highest part being Mt. Spurr which has an elevation of 11,069 feet. Except for the villages on the coast the area appears to be uninhabited.

The Kenai Peninsula area was the subject of investigation and report by the Division of Investigations, but in view of the information available in this office, the Office of Indian Affairs, and of the Fish and Wildlife Service concerning this alternate area, it is not believed that a field investigation is necessary.

It is recommended that the proposed order be submitted to the President.

The area now proposed to be withdrawn is a substitution for the MUG 11 PORSIGNARenal Peninsula area. By conference and correspondence between representatives of the War and Interior Departments, it was determined that the Kenai Peninsula area was important and valuable for the preservation of wildlife and other purposes, and that the alternate area across Cook Inlet would suit the purposes of the War Department. lug 1

Within the area now proposed to be withdrawn are 91.01 acres of patented mission and trade and manufacturing sites, and approximately ERIOR DEP 25,000 acres were withdrawn by Executive Order No. 2141 of February 27, 1915, and subsequently designated as the Moquawkie Mativo Reser-G 12 194 vation, near the village of Tyonek. There is also an outstanding CRETARIER coal prospecting permit embracing 287 acres adjoining one of the patented claims.

Army requests withdrawal with immediate right of entry 4,220 acres in Ts. 6 N., Rs. 11 and 12 N., Seward Meridian, within 6-aile strip under our jurisdiction in Kenai National Moose Range. Please discuss with representatives of the Army and Fish and Wildlife Service concerning Army needs and any restrictions and stipulations that should be incorporated in the public land order. You may then issue a temporary permit authorizing immediate right of entry subject to valid existing rights, and to any stipulations that may be found necessary and report the issuance of the permit immediately with your recommendations to this office.
