P.S. I must call your attention to the fact that we have only two children in the hospital at present. This time a year ago the hospital was full, and we had about fifteen children sick in bed in the two dormitories. Altho we are struggling thru an epidemic of colds, so far, the children seem able to throw off the sickness quite well.

Dear Dr. Salazar:

This office is endeavoring to obtain a complete census of all Indians and Eskimos residing in Alaska. This will be of considerable benefit to the office and will be of great value for future reference. As we do not have a government teacher in Kanakanak we would like to have you obtain this information for us. Perhaps the U. S. Commissioner already has a census which you could obtain from him and thus save a great deal of work.

This census should include men, women and children of all ages. Blank forms upon which to enter this information are enclosed herewith. Enter the names alphabetically with the family name first, then the christian name or names, the age, relationship to the head of the family, degree of native blood and in the last column the present address if regular residents are in some other community.

Send two complete copies to this office and keep a third copy for the records at your station. You should also, for the benefit of the older residents, fix definite birthdays. A number of the stations were formerly supplied with a book of "Vital Statistics and Miscellaneous Record" which should be of some assistance in determining ages.

Also, if at any time you make trips to villages where we have no representative, it would be a great assistance to this office if you could obtain a census for those villages. This, however, must be done without additional expense to the government.

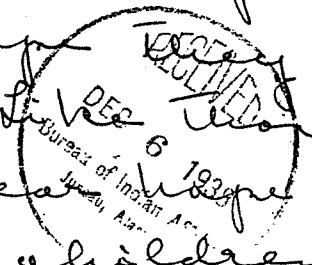
