By Executive Order No. $1919\frac{1}{2}$, dated April 21, 1914, a tract of land at the head of Turnagain Arm, Alaska, was withdrawn and reserved for townsite purposes under the act of March 12, 1914 (39 Stat. 305).

By Executive Order No. 3515, dated July 18, 1921, the above mentioned tract, together with other tracts, was eliminated from Executive Order No. 1919 of April 21, 1914 and restored to settlement and entry.


