SUBJECT: Staking Winter Trails - Seward Peninsula -

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Answering your question to Mr. Dunham during your telephone conversation this morning, the preparation of specifications, advertising, awarding of contracts and inspection for final payment to stake winter trails was administered by the Fairbanks Division of B.P.R. for the work accomplished during the 1958-59 winter season.

Reference to Mr. Swick's memorandum to Mr. Johansen dated October 14, 1958 indicates that the work was accomplished for the Alaska Public Works and Highway Department on a reimbursable basis. This was reimbursable agreement 0040-33, issued in the amount of \$1700.00. This appropriation was to cover the total cost of the project, including contract obligations.

The trails to be staked for the 1959-60 winter season are summarized below:

#### 1. Kotzebue Area

- 9 miles (a) Kotzebue to Sheshalik
- (b) South Angak Point to Island near mouth of Noatak River 8 miles
- (c) Mouth of Melbourn Channel to Singerachek 12 miles
- (d) Kotzebue to South Angak Point 5 miles

#### 2. Golovin Area

(a) Golovin to White Mountain 12 miles (b) Golovin to McKinley Creek 6 miles 8 miles (c) Walla Walla to Elim

#### 3. Teller Area

(a)	Teller	to Igloo Creek	6	miles
(b)	Teller	to Alission	6	miles
(c)	Teller	to Cape Douglas Trail	12	miles
(d)	Teller	around Lagoon Channel	3	miles
(e)	Teller	to Mary's Igloo	43	miles

SUBJECT: Winter Trails

Enclosed is a map showing the location of active winter trails with sections maintained by the Alaska Road Commission, excepting that at St. Michael. That in red represents those portions for which we provide maintenance funds.

The trail from Kotzebue to Selawik appears to be the most heavily traveled. The Commissioner at Kotzebue reports that up to 400 persons used this trail last winter.

In response to your telephone call the following information has been gathered concerning the Golovin-Elim Trail.

- 1. The total length is 27 miles (scaled from the map) of which 6 miles has been staked each winter by the ARC.
- 2. Based upon previous contract prices this additional staking will cost:

21 miles @ \$5 - \$105.00

3. Local bush pilots who fly regularly in the vicinity of Golovin-Elim state that none of them have requested the staking of this trail as an aid to navigation. All state that rough terrain makes flying along the trail hazardous when visibility is poor. Possibly the person requesting the trail staking threw this in as additional evidence to support the need for the trail.

There follows a description of the winter trails maintained by the ARC.
