Dear Mr. Nagley:

Then we left Alaska I promised to let you know the results of some of our conferences and efforts that we were making to procure road appropriations for the district in and around Talkeetna. You are familiar with most of the efforts that we made in this line, until you left us at Valdez. Will say that you or I, one or both, of us forgot to bring your copies of the petition that we had prepared on that trip; however, I had one copy that had many signatures on it and made use of it. We were both fortunate and unfortunate at Juneau. Wagner and I failed to make contact with Ike Taylor there, but we were lucky in that Governor Troy boarded our boat on his way to the states.

Through Mr. Murray's efforts we were able to get a conference with the Governor while on the boat. In that conference we stressed the need of roads to our properties which included Peters Creek, Alaska Exploration, and Cash Creek, and we had a very favorable reaction from the Governor; in fact, he made special efforts to have arrangements made whereby we could meet and talk with Ike Taylor on his arrival in Seattle on the boat following ours. That conference with Taylor was duly carried out a week later, and the results are that we have a promise for road development through this whole district. Naturally these promises for roads are contingent to some extent on the appropriations that are coming up. The Governor informed us that road building in Alaska had been placed upon a six-year development plan and that they were in hopes that they would be able to speed that development up some. The road referred to has been placed in the budget of the road commission to receive \$150,000 for this development program.

In the conference with the Governor, the problem of immediate work in the Talkeetna district was taken up. Mr. Murray and the rest of us had outlined a little work that we suggested might be done this winter on the N.R.A. program, which would give employment to ten or twelve men out for Talkeetna. The suggestions were favorably received, but I have not heard whether or not they were carried out. I am in hopes that the men are there by this time.

I think it might be well to outline to you, so that you can communicate to all others interested in this road project, the things that we have requested, and that we feel are likely to be put over on this development. After discussing the whole thing thoroughly with Mr. Murray, and we had already discussed it with the Peters Creek people, we all fully decided that the most feasible and economical course of this road would be to take a route from the Peters Creek Bridge up the creek on the gravel benches to Peters Creek Camp; from there, follow the road as it is now used to Elwell Cabin; then cross Peters Creek in a direction toward our Bird Creek property until the Cash Creek summit is reached, and from there continue the road down Cash Creek to the Cash Creek Camp. Thus all efforts at development will be put on one road only, and this one road would serve practically all of the mining camps in the whole district. Mr. Murray brought out that the abandonment of the road from the Peters Creek Bridge around to Cash Creek as it is now used, would not cause anyone any inconvenience for there is no one on that section of the road who is actively engaged in mining or even prospecting; hence, it would be lots cheaper and more economical to put the road around as proposed. Mr. Taylor said in conference that he expected to put men in and survey the proposed route from Peters Creek Bridge to Peters Creek Camp, just as soon as the snow was off so that they could work and so of course the expectations are that work will start immediately following that.

I thought it would be a very good idea to let you and others interested in Talkeetna know exactly what we had planned and what we were asking for, because it is only by the help of all and the unified action toward a definite program that we can expect to get the best results. Hope that this proposition appeals to you and Tom, and all of the others concerned in Talkeetna. Surely would be agreeable to McDonald because it passes right through the property that he is interested in.

We are getting along very busily out here this winter, preparing for our return to Alaska and getting finances in shape to take care of the Coffield and Carlson property. At the present time our expectation is to land in Talkeetna in time to do our freighting as usual, up to the Placer camp. I presume that as usual you are very busy taking care of all of the activities of the Commercial Club, the Kiwanis, Good Fellowship, and all other civic activities of Talkeetna. Surely hope that you are enjoying it as much as you did the social activities on our trip out. Give my best to friend; Tom and Jack and other inquiring parties in Talkeetna.

Dear Sir:

Your letter to Dr. Smith which was referred to the Governor's Office has been referred to this office for reply.

You are advised that the project to extend the present Cache Creek road up Peters Creek to Cache Creek has been included in a program of road construction submitted to the Administration of Public Works. As yet, no funds have been allotted for this project and it is not known at this time what action will be taken. It is evident, however, at this time that our regular funds will be sufficient only for maintenance of the existing system and the extension of the Cache Creek road cannot be performed unless funds are made available by the Public Works Administration.

It is noted that you state that the balance of roads in the Territory obtained funds for work. This is not entirely correct. There were a number of projects, however, for which funds were definitely allocated by the Public Works. This group did not include all the meritorious projects by any means and it was necessary for the Road Commission to expend these funds on the projects to which they were definitely allocated.
