A BILLL

To extend the provisions of the Federal Highway Act to
the Territory of Alaska under prescribed limitation and
regulations, and to abolish the Roard of Road Commissioners
for Alaska.

Be it enacted by the Sprate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

Sec. 1. That beginning with the fiscal year to-wit, July lst, 1926, the Territory of Alaska shall be entitled to share in all ab ropriations hereafter available for apportionment under the Federal Mighway Act, reproved Mo. 9, 1921 (42 Otat. 212), and one act amendatory thereof or sup lementary thereto, upon the same ratio of apportionment as applied to the several "tates, or such ratio as the "coretary of Agriculture may deem to be required: Provided, that the area, population, and mileage of rural delivery routes and star routes which constitute the apportionment under dection 21 of the Federal Highway Act shell include for that our one the area, population, and allege of said rural delivery routes and star routes of the Tirritory our and less than an wholf of the total area of Ale are Provided further. Highway Commission, acting in the same capacity as the State Highway Commissions of the reveral States, and Territorial officials shall occupy the same relation in this Act as those Provided further, That all funds so of the foveral "tates: a portioned to Alaska shall be devoted to construction and maintenance of trails, sledroads, roads, trams, postal aeroplane landings, ferries, operations of ferries, and shelter cabins in such proportion and character as the Secretary of Agriculture, in his discretion shall deem proper for the general economic development of the Territory of Alacka; Provided further, That the so-called "Alaska Fund" devoted to roads, trails and bridges in the Territory of Alacka, under the 1 thoi Congress, Approved January 27, 1905, and any Act amendatory thereof, or sup lementary thereto, shall be covered into the treasury of the Territory of Alaska for construction and maintenance of trails, sledroads, reads, trace, postel aero-plane landings, ferries, operations of ferries and shelter cabins.

papers, maps, and documents utilized in the exercise of such
powers, for the use of the Jercitorial Bishway Commission in
the administration of the construction and maintenance of
trails, eledroads, roads, trams, costal sero-plane landings,
ferries, and chelter cabins in the Territory of Alaska.
