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

My dear Governor:


Herewith enclosed is a copy of a draft of a bill which Mr. Patterson will introduce in the House.

The bill appropriates \$20,000 to be used in conjunction with \$15,000 appropriated by the Alaska Road Commission for the construction of a six mile road between Fort Liscum and the southerly end of Mile 4 of the Valdez-Fairbanks wagon road.

This proposed road, when constructed, will really be part of the Valdez-Fairbanks wagon road and will make Fort Liscum accessible and also open up the mineral belt on the South shore of Valdez Bay where the Granby Mine is situated.

The bill means a great deal to Valdez and vicinity. Transportation between Valdez, Granby Mine and Fort Liscum must now be made entirely by water and at times, owing to storms, that is very difficult and people are greatly handicapped.

The fact that the Alaska Road Commission is willing to supply \$15,000 for this project, to be used in conjunction with the \$20,000.00 we hope to get from the Territory ought to be some proof that the project is meritorious. In fact if you are in any doubt about this matter you may have a talk wit Captain Zug of the Alaska Road Commission or with Mr. Patterson, the Representative from this section or with any one else who is familiar with condition here. All of the people here hope and respectfully request that if the bill comes to you in the form of a law that you will not veto it but will on the contrary do everything you consistently can to secure the passage of the act.

Dear Mr. Dimond:-

I have your letter of March 7th, enclosing the draft of a bill for the construction of a wggon road between Fort Liscum and Valdez. We are at present trying to frame a bill which will allow the Territorial Road Commission to enter into co-operative agreements. If this bill should go through the question of building the proposed road will receive the serious consideration of the board.

I do not think that there is much chance for special appropriations to pass at this session of the legislature, nor am I sure that it would be good policy to advocate such special appropriation, as the Territorial board of Road Commissioners are in receipt of requests which are almost in the nature of demands for special projects. I only wish that the Territory was in a position to aid all of them.

A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED:

An Act to provide for the construction and maintenance of a wagon road from For Liscum, Alaska, to Mile 4 of the Valdez-Fairbanks wagon road, including a bridge across Lowe River on the line of said road, all in the Valdez Precinct, Third Division, Territory of Alaska, and making an appropriation therefor.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Sec. 1. There is hereby appropriated from any moneys in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska, not otherwise appropriate sum of \$30,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, the construction and maintenance of a wagon road from the Unite States Military Post at Fort Liscum, Alaska, along the shores of Valdez Bay, and a bridge across Lowe River on the line of said road, a distance of about six miles to and connecting with the Valdez-Fairbanks wagon road at or near the southerly end of Mil thereof, all in the Valdez Recording Precinct, Third Bigston, Territory of Alaska.

Sec. 2. The estimated cost of said road and bridge is \$25,000, and the appropriation herein made for the construction thereof is made upon the express understanding that the limits
