Dear Colonel:

I am enclosing a voucher signed by Ed McCann. (the Nushagak- Togiak trail)
As you know it was to be inspected by Mr. Reed. He accepted it but did not send me any specifications or data in regard to it.

I am enclosing hid letter. (SEE file 13/63-2)

I was notified that the work had been completed on the Tooluk-sak, Aniak trail and the Aniak - Kolmakofsky trail. I made a trip over them and, as I wired you, was unable to accept them. They had erected no beacons and many of the tripods were away under eight feet. On account of the depth of the snow through the timber, it was impossible to slash the trail to the ground, twelve feet wide. High stumps would have been left. They shoveled out snow on each side of the trail and cut the trees and brush close to the ground but it is not twelve feet wide. What they have done along this line is good and represents a great deal of work, but it does not fulfill the specifications. Work like this can be done successfully only in the early fall. I reccommend that the contractors be allowed to put up the beacons and complete the trail this fall if they wish to do so.

One of the cabins was not finished. The other was a very good cabin but neither of them had floors in. My copy of the specifications does not say whether or not a floor is required. Is it?

Hansen will stake a trail from the government cabin on Crooked across to Flat for \$800.00, erecting tripods 300 feet apart. This trail would cut off at least twelve miles from the distance now travelled and avoid the bad hills and sidling places which make the present trail so bad.

He will build a cabin at Horn Village between Napamute and Crooked for \$450.00 making it 12 by 14, of logs with dirt and iron roof, a floor, two windows, stove and door. This cabin would break a 45-mile run and would be a big help.

He will cut a trail between Napamute and Kolmakofsky, 9 miles long, for \$300.00. There is an old native trail through here but it is too brushy to go over with a long sled. This trail would cut out a bad bend in the river where the ice jams and makes travel very difficult.

All of these bids are low but Hansen is very anxious to get the work done as he goes over this route four times a month in the winter with the mail. I reccommend that he be given this work if possible as it is all much needed and Hansen has done the best trail and cabin work that we have had done.




