Dear Mr. Smith:

Regarding the project which is locally known as the Ketchikan Creek road which I have understood was to be constructed by the Forestry Service and the Territorial Road Commission, I have been advised that the appropriation of \$1500.00, which amount was necessary in order to cooperate with the Forestry Service, had been refused on the grounds that the Territorial Road Commission had considered the proposition a municipal matter. As a matter of fact the proposed road is not situated in the city limits but would extend from the city limits up along the Ketchikan Creek and past a tract of land which the Government has reserved from a mining claim for Ketchikan as a park site. As the city has no funds with which to build a park it was necessary to "pass the hat" and up to date about \$5,000.00 has been subscribed. It probably will be necessary to "pass the hat" again in order to do all the work necessary to complete the park. This proposed road will not only benefit the people of Ketchikan but it will be quite an attraction for the tourists as at the present time the trams which were erected by a mining company and the power company are decayed and it is almost impossible to walk on them.

This creek seems to be advertised quite extensively as most of the tourists start for the creek just as soon as they land and especially during the season when the salmon are running. This road will also help build up the country as it will open up a territory where a number of homes could be erected. It is my understanding that you are a member of the Territorial Road Commission and I am wondering if you would not

Dear Mr. Larson:

I am in receipt of your letter of June 24th, regarding the Ketchikan Creek road.

When the Wards Cove-Lighthouse Station-Ketchikan Creek road project was presented to the Board of Territorial Road Commissioners by Major Waugh, it was in such light as led us to believe the road would serve no other purpose but to lead to a park which was being developed by the people of Ketchikan, and our thought in modifying the agreement to the exclusion of the latter part of the project was this was hardly a proper use to which to apply territorial road funds. Other towns of the Territory might wish to develop parks to which they would desire roads extended and which would be difficult of refusal after having established a precedent with the Ketchikan park road.

From your letter and from a copy of one which I have from the Ketchikan Commercial Club addressed to the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners, I am led to believe that the road would serve other purposes than those merely connected with the park. It is to be regretted that this information was not before us when this project was passed upon, and serves to illustrate the difficulties under which we labor in passing upon projects of which we have no personal knowledge.

The matter will no doubt be brought up before an early meeting of the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners. Whether or not it is too late now to restore the agreement as originally presented, I am at this writing unadvised. However, in view of the information contained in your letter, and that of the Commercial Club, I shall be glad to do what I can towards such restoration.

Gentlemen:-

We are advised by the local Forestry office that the cooperative agreement entered into between the Alaska Road Commission, the Forestry Service, and anticipating cooperation on the part of the Territorial Road Commission, covering the project of building a road to Ward's Cove, and from the City limits of Ketchikan on the south to the new Lighthouse station, and from the City limits of Ketchikan on the east and along Ketchikan creek to the park now under construction, had been modified by your Honorable Board by the elimination of that section of the project along Ketchikan creek.

This Commercial Club as well as the citizens generally of Ketchikan and vicinity would most respectfully request that the Territorial Board reconsider its action in this matter and join, in a cooperative way, with the Alaska Road Commission and Forestry Service in their desire to have this much needed thoroughfare put through, for the following reasons:

1. This piece of road, 1600 feet in length, is entirely without the corporate limits of the City, and therefore City funds are not available for such construction.

2. The citizens of Ketchikan have already donated, by subscription, the sum of \$5,000 for the construction and maintenance of a park at the end of this proposed road for the exclusive and free use of the public, which park can only be reached by the construction of a highway beyond the City limits.

3. It is not probable that any other piece of road in the Territory of Alaska ever will handle the amount of traffic that will patronize this highway when completed, not only with reference to local people, but for its scenic beauty as an attraction for tourists and others who may visit the City. Not only this, but its commercial use both to industry and residents who are now living, with others building homes, beyond the City limits along the line of the proposed road, makes it a public necessity at this time.

4. Both the Alaska Road Commission and the Forestry Service have expressed their great desire to participate in the construction of this beneficial and much needed highway, but are powerless to act without the cooperation of your Commission.

5. The people of Ketchikan feel that as a matter of right the small amount of money required from the Territory for this project should be appropriated from the money collected from them in the way of taxes.

For these reasons we would respectfully urge you to reconsider your action and cooperate with the other two branches of the service to the end that the Ketchikan Creek section of the entire project may be pushed to completion.

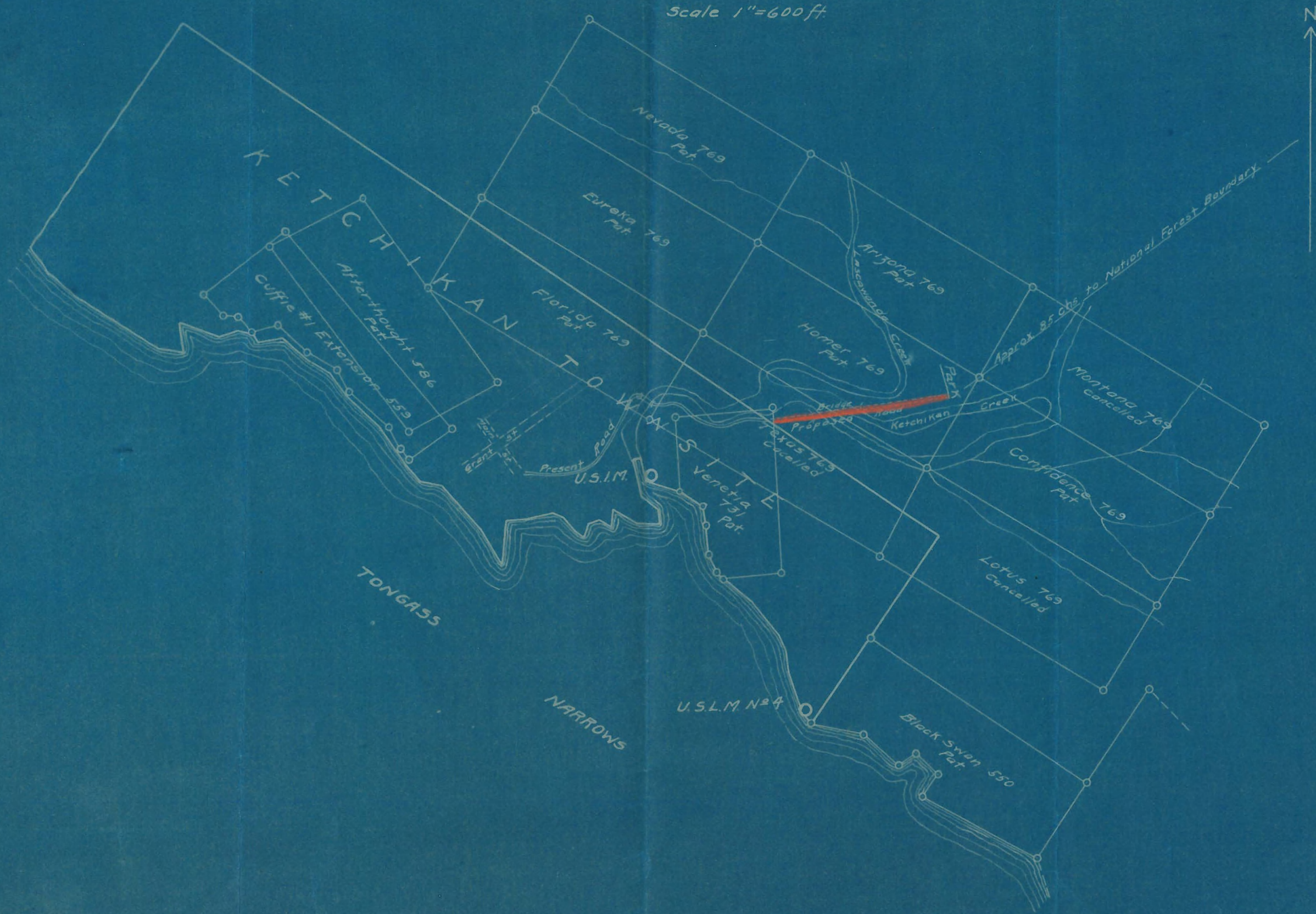

I write to advise you of an apportionment having been made in the sum of \$25,456.77 in Forest Reserve Fund of the Territory; such amount having been received from the Treasury of the United States in settlement of the Territory's statutory percentage of receipts from National Forests in Alaska for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1919; the said apportionment being as follows:-

To Appropriation for Maintenance of a Public School System in Alaska, under provisions of Chap. 74, Session Laws of 1915, twenty-five per centum or,-----\$ 6,364.17

Of the above noted amounts be advised that the sum of \$4,773.15 is available to the Divisional Road Commission, First Road District, for requisition and expenditure under provisions of Chapter II, Session Laws of Alaska, 1919, in addition to amounts heretofore appropriated.

For your information I would state that according to records of this office total sum of \$33,500. has been expended in the First Road District during the current year from moneys appropriated by the 1919 Session of the Legislature; \$12,500.00 of said sum having been expended by the Terr. Divisional Road Commission and \$21,000.00 by the Alaska Road Commission under co-operative agreements with the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners.
