I write to advise you of an apportionment having been made in the sum of \$25,456.77 in the Forest Reserve Fund of the Territory; such amount having been received from the Treasury of the United States in settlement of the Territory's percentage of receipts from National Forests in Alaska for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1919; the said apportionment being as follows:-

To Appropriation for Maintenance of a Public School System in Alaska, under provisions fo Chap. 74, Session Laws of 1915, twenty-five per centum or,-----\$ 6,364.17

To Appropriation for Construction, Maintenance and Protection of Public Roads, Bridges and Trails throughout Alaska, under provisions of Chap. 27, Session Laws of 1915; seventy-five per centum to be divided equally among the Four Road Districts of the Territory.

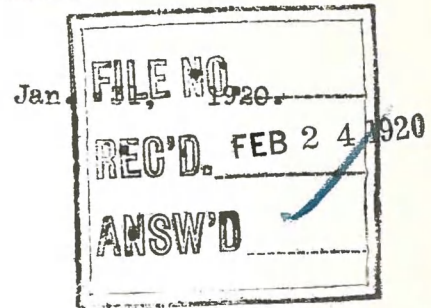
