DEED

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
TO
STATE OF ALASKA

THIS DEED, made this 30th day of November, 1964, by the United States of America, grantor, acting by and through the Secretary of the Interior, to the State of Alaska, grantee,

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Section 46(a) of the Alaska Omnibus Act of June 25, 1959 (73 Stat. 152) authorizes the President, in the event any disputes arise between the United States and the State of Alaska, prior to January 1, 1965, concerning the transfer, conveyance, or other disposal of property to the State of Alaska pursuant to Section 6(e) of the Alaska Statehood Act of July 7, 1958 (72 Stat. 340), to appoint a temporary commission to consider, ascertain, adjust, determine, and settle such disputes, and

WHEREAS, the President by Executive Order 11144 of March 5, 1964 (29 F.R. 3129) established such a commission to be known as the Temporary Alaska Claims Commission to determine and settle the dispute between the United States and the State of Alaska concerning the hereinafter described property, as well as other properties, and directed the Secretary of the Interior to transfer, convey, or otherwise dispose of such properties to the State of Alaska to the extent necessitated by the settlements made by the said Commission; and

WHEREAS, said Commission on October 10, 1964, reported to the Secretary of the Interior that the hereinafter described property should be transferred to the State of Alaska;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, and pursuant to the action of the Commission dated October 10, 1964, the Secretary of the Interior, for and on behalf of the United States of America, does hereby transfer and convey unto the State of Alaska and its assigns, pursuant to Section 6(e) of the Alaska Statehood Act, all right, title, and interest of the United States of America in and to the following-described lands in Alaska:

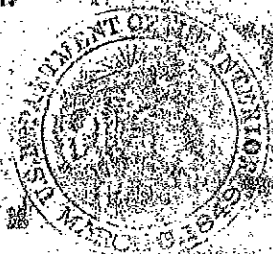
A part of United States Survey No. 2262 at Dillingham, Alaska, described as follows:

Beginning at Corner No. 2, United States Survey No. 2262; thence

- East, 10.68 chains along line 2-3 of said Survey No. 2262;
- South, 15.93 Chains;
- West, 5.27 chains;
- N. 10°30' W., 5.75 chains;
- S. 82°30' W., 3.03 chains to a point in line 1-2 of said Survey No. 2262;
- N. 7°15' W., 10.75 chains along line 1-2 of said survey to the point of beginning, containing 13.64 acres, more or less.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the granted premises with all the rights, easements, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, to the State of Alaska and its assigns forever.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the United States of America has caused these presents to be executed in its name by the Secretary of the Interior and the seal of the Department of the Interior to be hereunto affixed on the day and year first above written.

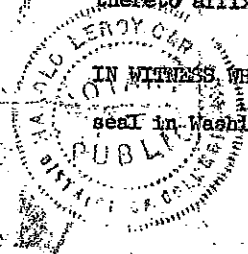
