Dear Sir: In as much as the Forms filled out by Nathaniel Williams are incomplete, it is necessary that they be returned and the omitted information be given. On the reverse side of Form 56 "Contract of Employment" under "Withholding Exemption Certificate" this part of the Form must be filled out so that we will know how much to deduct for income tax.
