The request contained in your letter of 22 April has been studied by appropriate planning and engineering agencies of this Headquarters. In view of the fact that the proposed road and the Lazelle road traverse a sensitive military area, it is regretted that this Headquarters cannot concur in either of the locations for the new access road.

A suggested alternate route is one extending from the Steese Highway through the area north of the Ladd Field Reservation to Chena Hot Springs. Such a route would provide access to presently unserviced homestead areas as well as to the Springs.
