The Special Survey Division with which I am associated is engaged in making precipitation, snow, etc, observations at high elevations in the Tanana drainage areas. In order to establish stations that may be conveniently visited, the following information is required in your area:

- 1. How far have you progressed with the Chena Hot Springs road? Will it be open to travel this summer? How far will it be open? Can you supply me with a sketch of tens read in accompanying me
- 2. Is the Chena Hot Springs roadhouse open all winter? Is it accessible by light plane in winter?
- 3. Is the Miller house open this winter and is it accessible by light plane in winter? When do you open the Circle road for summer use?
 - 4. Is Circle Hot Springs open and is the field operating?
 - . 5. How about the Goodpaster field? Shi William
 - When is the Steese Highway open to 12 Mile Summit?
- When will the Goodpaster Road be open? Is there anyone at the camp as a watchman in winter? Is old "Alabam" up there? If we 8. Can you land in winter near 12 Mile Summit any place?

 As I recall it them. put in a station, could be be an observer gratis (observance a month)?

As I recall it there is a flat place west of the summit about a mile or perhaps a half. It seems to me that would be out of strong winds. Would the bush fliers know about this? It would be ideal for snow

(8) Bush pilots have made landings near 12 Mile Summit. However, they do not recommend that Landings be made under any circumstances other than "emergency."

Have shown a few new roads on your map as follows: Extension of the Chena Pump Station Road; Branch of Farmers Loop; New Farm Road West and South of Fairbanks on (D-2); Steel Creek Road; Extension of Badger Road and Farm Roads on East side of Chena Slough.

Deese De January 17, 1950 Mr. Donald MacDonald, e/o District Engineer. Special Survey Division, Fort Richardson, Alaska. Dear Mac: Reference your letter of 10 January 1950. Construction of the Chena Hot Springs Road has not been started, nor has any money been appropriated for its construction. The survey has been completed to the Springs. However, we have a Farm Road which follows a part of the Chena Survey constructed to within about 4 miles of the Little Chena which is called the Steel Greek Road and is shown on your two maps in green ink. There is no one operating a roadhouse or mess house at Chena Hot Springs; a caretaker is in charge of the place. It is accessible by small plane twelve months of the year. Miller House is open throughout the year. It is not accessible by plane. The Circle Road is usually opened by June 1. Circle Hot Springs and Field all Okay. However, at times, field blows clear of snow, in view of which, skis cannot be used; when this happens, the Field at Central can be used. The Goodpaster Field is used some during the Summer but is no good during Winter. Bush pilots advise ski landings can be made near it during Winter months. (6) Steese Highway is usually open to 12 Hile Summit about May 15. When will the Goodpaster Road be open? As you asked in regard to "Alabam", think you are referr ing to the Elliott Highway or as it is commonly called, the "Livengood Road." This road is usually opened by about May 10 or possibly earlier. The mining company, no doubt, has a watchman on their dredge. "Alabam" is still in the Livengood area but he has "slowed down" considerably. I believe an observer could be secured for a month, gratis, at Livengood.
