The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities considers that any local road listed in the Omnibus Act quit claim deeds to be subject to a 50 foot easement each side of centerline under P.L.O. 1613 and should not be listed under 44 L.D. 513.

The Department of Transportation and Public Facilities is not especially interested in having the quit claim deed noted on the status plats. The Department does consider that for local roads listed in the quit claim deed, there is a 50 foot easement each side of centerline by P.L.O. 1613. This easement is what we wish to be noted on the status maps. This lack of notation on the B.L.M. status map for the local road system on the B.L.M. status maps has caused the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities no end of difficulty with the public. Since the P.L.O. 1613 is noted on your maps for primary and secondary highways, we request that you note it also for local roads.
