John F. Bennett, being first duly sworn upon oath, deposes and says:

- 1. I am an engineering supervisor employed by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, Northern Region, Right-of-Way section.
- 2. As part of the planning for this project I researched the extent of the existing right-of-way in the manner described in the attached letter to Michael Price dated May 26, 1989. (Exhibit A). My conclusion was that the width of the

right-of-way was 50 feet from the centerline of Davis road into many of the properties including Parcels 1 and 2 (the Keener and Bowers properties).

- The Bowers and the Keeners have contended that the state previously represented that the width of Davis Road was They have based this contention on the fact that only 33 feet. the plats depicting acquisitions for the University Avenue South project, where it intersects with Davis Road showed only an easement 33 feet either side of centerline and possibly on a preliminary depiction of the Davis road project which contained No other support for that contention has similar information. been produced.
- The University Avenue plat was based on a report from Alaska Title Guarantee performed for DOT&PF showing that right-of-way to be 33 feet either side of centerline. (Exhibit It appears that report may well have been in error. 1988 right of way plans for Davis road were the first official set of plans depicting the width of Davis road. Those plans show the road to be 50 feet from the centerline into parcels 1 and 2 A preliminary depiction used based on my research. University Avenue South project did show the width to be 33 feet This depiction was also based on a report from from centerline. Alaska Title Guarantee.
- I have not found any evidence in state records which would suggest that state personnel made any deliberate decision to abandon a portion of the right-of-way. Prior depictions of AFFIDAVIT OF JOHN BENNETT State v. Keener, et al. - 2 4FA-89-1854 Civil

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the right-of-way are inconsistent. Some show it as 100 feet wide while show it as 66 feet.

I have been unable to find any evidence that any state personnel represented directly to the Keeners or the Bowers that the width of the road was only 33 feet.

The old University Avenue South plat was done by DOT.
