To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, a Certificate of the Land Office at Anchorage, Alaska, is now deposited in the Bureau of Land Management, whereby it appears that pursuant to the grant of lands under the Act of Congress of July 28, 1956 (70 Stat. 711), as supplemented by the Act of July 7, 1958 (72 Stat. 339), the State of Alaska has selected the 6 right-of-way lots, U. S. Survey No. 2321; Lots 18 and 20, U. S. Survey No. 2589; Lots 20, 23 and 23A, U. S. Survey No. 2900; Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 16, 17, 18 and 19, U. S. Survey No. 2921; Lots 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 20, U. S. Survey No. 2922; Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, U. S. Survey No. 2967; Lots 9, 11, 12, 13 and 14, U. S. Survey No. 2968; Lots 20, 22 and 23, U. S. Survey No. 2969; Lots 4A and 5A, U. S. Survey No. 2905; Lots 19, 20, 23, 24, 24A, 27, 28, 30, 31 and 40A, U. S. Survey No. 3088; Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30, U. S. Survey No. 3398; Lots 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22, U. S. Survey No. 3403; Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, and 6, U. S. Survey No. 3709; and Lots 17 and 18 in Section 33, Township 58 south, Range 79 east, Copper River Meridian, Alaska.

The areas described aggregate 1,930.92 acres, according to the Official Plats of the Surveys of the said Lands, on file in the Bureau of Land Management:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the said Acts of Congress, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said State of Alaska, and to its assigns the tracts of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said State of Alaska, and to its assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights

for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right-of-way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

There is also reserved to the United States a right-of-way for the construction of railroads, telegraph and telephone lines in accordance with the Act of March 12, 1914 (38 Stat. 305, 48 U.S.C. sec. 305).

Excepting, however, from this conveyance those certain roads and trails and all appurtenances thereto, constructed by the United States, through, over, or upon the lands described in U. S. Surveys Nos. 3709, 3398 and 3403, and the right of the United States, its officers, agents, or employees to maintain, operate, repair, or improve the same so long as needed or used for or by the United States.
