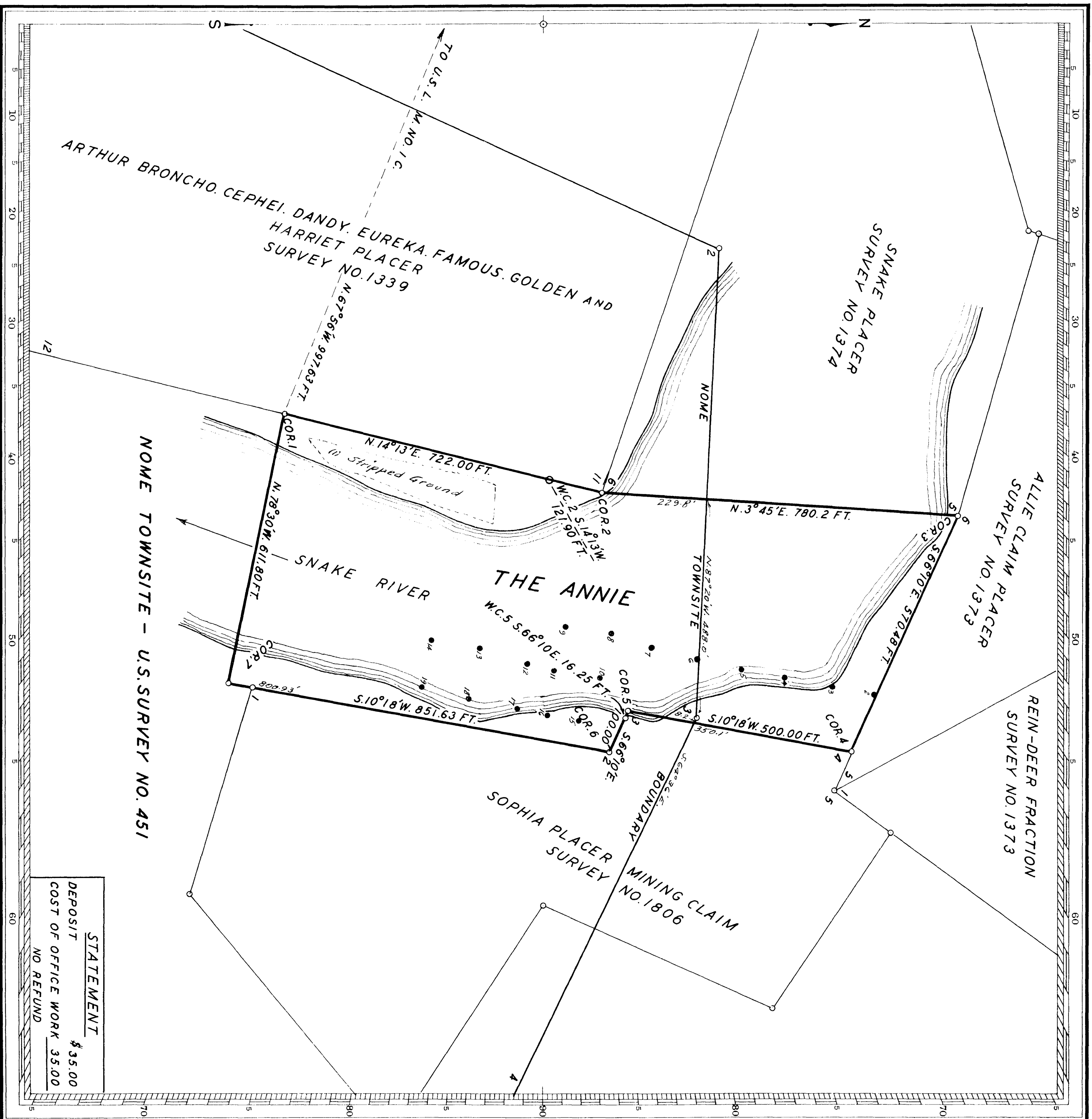

MEMORANDUM

Feet.

Mineral Survey No. 1892 was made with a Bausch & Lomb light transit No. 7932, having a 4.25-inch horizontal limb with 2 double opposite verniers and a full 4-inch vertical circle having 1 double vernier. The eye piece is equipped with a colored glass set in the dust shutter for making direct observation on the sun.

The instrument was in good order and adjustment at time of survey.

I obtained my meridian from line 1-2, Survey No. 1891, Black Cat Fraction Placer Mining Claim, just previously surveyed by myself.

This claim was measured with a 500-foot Lufkin standard steel tape, graduated at every foot, the foot at each end being graduated into tenths.

The magnetic variation observed at each corner of the survey gave a uniform value of $16^{\circ}30'E$.

Beginning at Cor. No. 1, on line 11-12, Survey No. 1339, Arthur Broncho Cephei Dandy Eureka Famous Golden and Harriet, where I,

LOCATION MONUMENT

U.S.L.M. No. 1C to which this claim is tied is a fir post, 6 ins. sq. and 8 ft. long. It is so badly rotted that I replace it by an iron pipe, 4 ins. in dia. and 7 ft. long with a 5/16" brass plate welded to top. This plate was marked U.S.L.M. No. 1C with cross for true point. The pipe was set 3½ ft. in ground and a sod mound, 5 ft. base and 3 ft. high erected around same.

R E P O R T

- a. The soil of this claim is principally frozen muck about 6 ft. thick, overlying a body of auriferous gravel, the surface supporting a growth of moss and grass. However, where Snake River runs through the claim there is no overburden whatsoever on the gravel.
- b. There is no timber on this claim.
The only stream of running water on this claim is Snake River, averaging about 450 ft. wide and 3 to 6 ft. deep.
- c. The workings and improvements on this claim consist of stripped ground and drill holes, more fully described in the foregoing part of these field notes.
- d. The nearest town and post office to this claim is Nome, a town of about 1000 inhabitants, situated on the shore of Bering Sea, directly east of the claim.
- e. There are no lodes or systems of lodes in the vicinity or on this claim.
- f. This claim is well adapted for placer mining purposes, after the removal of the overburden and thawing, by dredging. It is the intention of the owner to work it by this method in the near future.
Water for mining purposes is furnished by Snake River flowing through the claim.
- g. The workings and expenditures on this claim consist of the items mentioned under paragraph "C" of this report.
- h. There are no mines, salt licks, salt, mineral or hot springs, mill sites, Indian Reservations nor oil leases on this claim.

WHITE the undersigned on this day in accordance with the laws of the United States and the local rules and regulations and being otherwise legally entitled to do, located and claim for placer mining purposes the following described tract of land situated on Snake River in the Cape Nome Mining District, District of Alaska being a portion of the otherwise unoccupied and unappropriated Public Domain and suitable for Mining Purposes only to wit:

Commencing at the initial stake being the south center end stake and upon which a true copy of this notice is posted thence in an easterly direction as near as practicable at right angles to the general course of the stream 530 ft to corner stake #1 thence at right angles in a northerly direction up stream and as near as practicable parallel to the general course thereof 1320 ft to corner stake #2 thence in a westerly direction at right angles 530 ft to corner stake #3 thence at right angles in a southerly direction down stream and as near as practicable to the general course thereof 1320 ft to corner stake #4, thence at right angles to the place of beginning being initial stake 530 ft. This claim shall be known as THE ANNIE on Snake River.
